Sprinter Lemao's secret weapon

Modest Matebedi gives SA first 100m world champ

Athletics coach Thabo Matebedi's story is one that has the weight to lift off like that of Wayde van Niekerk's mentor Tannie Ans

Not many have heard of Matebedi but the rise of his charge Tshenolo Lemao to being a world champion will endear the modest 34-year-old coach from Atteridgeville to athletics folklore.

 $Matebedi\, is\, a\, sprint\, coach\, at\, Tuks\, Sport$ School. He handed South Africa its first world 100m champion in any age division when Lemao, 17, blitzed to gold in 10.57secs at the IAAF World U-18 Championships under way in Nairobi midweek.

Retshidisitswe Mlenga (10.51) completeda1-2 for SA with silver in the same race.

"It's unbelievable but it's a great feeling at the same time," Matebedi, a former sprinter, told Sowetan from Nairobi. "It didn't sink immediately at the stadi-

um but when got to my hotel room, I only

realised how big the achievement was and I was so happy that I bought a beer that I didn't even know to celebrate.' Matebedi also paid tribute to his mentor Hennie Kriel, the veteran in charge of rising stars Clarence Munyai and Gift

"I had to remind him [prior to Wednesday's final] of our goal that we set three years ago that his name will be in the world history books - that he'd be the last person in the world we'll see winning the 100m world under-18 title as this edition is the last of its kind to be staged.'
