THE PUMA School of Speed at Dal Josafat Stadium in Paarl saw outstanding performances this past weekend from talented high school athletes aiming to follow in the footsteps of the school's principal, Usain Bolt. The Western Cape track meet,

the fourth of five Puma School of Speed events due to be held across the country this year, saw young athletes competing in sprint aces, short hurdles, long jump and high jump.

With a Puma contract up for grabs, the following athletes produced stellar performances in Paarl and won premium Puma spikes and Spur Steak Ranches vouchers: Curwin Gertse of Paarl Gym-

nasium ran the U16 boys 110m hurdles in 13.49 seconds

Luciano Custodio of Paarl Boys High was close behind, crossing the line in 13.79 seconds.

ran the U16 Boys 100m sprint in 10.56 seconds.

HTS Drostdy came out tops, winning the trophy for best performing school on the day.

warding performance excellence.
