THE COCA-COLA Schools T20 Challenge, South Africa's premier schools cricket tournament, has kicked off and will once again be casting a spotlight on the best up and coming, young cricket talent in South Africa.

The three-day national finals will take place at the University of Pretoria Cricket Oval from 16-18 March, and will see the six franchise winners, as well as two of the best schools out of CSA's Focus Schools programme, battle

Bavuma, and a team of cricket experts will attend all 6 of the Coca-Cola Schools T20 Challenge franchise finals in search of outstanding players in the teams that do not qualify for the national finals.

The team of 12 players, two from each franchise final, will play in a curtain-raiser match against a CSA Development Hub team during the Coca-Cola Schools T20 Challenge National Finals.

The eventual six finalists will rerpresent the six CSA franchises, having come though their own provincial and franchise T20 finals.

On Wednesday, Hilton College became the first school to qualfify for the national finals. They were the KZN Inland champions and they beat the KZN Coastal representatives, Clifton College in a thrilling 62-run final.

Hilton College captain, James Ritchie said, "We did well to post a large total that made it difficult for the oposing team to chase down. This is a big win for our school as we haven't won the Dolphins final since 2015."
