## Chance to bag full points for Eagles

ROYAL Eagles will be determined to cement their turnaround in the National First Division when they host strong foes AmaZulu at Harry Gwala Stadium this afternoon.

When Eagles edged Tuks 1-0 in Protoria at the weekend, it was their first win in three outings and second in five assignments, which affected their pormotion chances.

The Durban-based Usuthu have better form than Kost Papic's home team, having won their last two games, including a remarkable 3-0 victory over Mages, who had confidence going into that clash at the weekend after beating Eagles 4-2 in their previous meeting.

Usuthu are placed sixth on the league standings with 35 points from 23 matches. They are a match behind their counterparts with only a point separating them.

Eagles, meanwhile, will be seeking redemption when they take on their rusis having falled to win their previous meeting in the first half of the season—losing 3-2 at the Princess Magogo Stadium. But Eagles did pick up that

All eyes will be on George, the
current top scorer in the second
tier. The 25-year-old forward who
has been in good scoring form
for his side, bagging 19 goals for
Eagles, four goals better than
Minenig Celes 15 for Thanda.
The Eastwood-born player will
be keen to make it two goals in
two games and help put his side
back in contention for a play of
