One more point in Thanda's bag

WITH another hard-earned point on Saturday - their third drawn match in a row - Thanda Royal Zulu took another small step forward in their quest for automatic promotion to the Premier Soccer League.

The 0-0 stalemate away to Royal Eagles was also their 11th draw of the season, to go along with 13 wins and a solitary loss.

This sees them now on 50 points with a positive goal difference of 23, having scored the most goals in the NFD (42) and conceded the fewest (19).

After a physically demanding three games in six days, Thanda can now regroup for the final five games of the season.

They have the advantage of two consecutive home fixtures: Magesi on Sunday and Stellenbosch on Sunday, 7 May.

Though lowly placed, Magesi will arrive on the back of a 2-0 win over Jomo Cosmos and a 3-0 win over fellow basement dwellers FC Cape Town, but this should be a certain three points for the Amabhubesi.

Nearest challengers Black Leopards have an even more formidable fixture list, meeting Jomo Cosmos on Wednesday, AmaZulu on Saturday and Royal Eagles the following Saturday
