Ke Yona graduate scores his first goal

Nedbank Ke Yona Team Search graduate, Aubrey Modiba became the second player from the

lower league opposition in a competitive fixture and extended their record in the compe-tition to just one defeat in their last 11 games.

The goal is a second in professional football for Modiba, who scored for

SuperSport in their CAF Confederation Cup clash against Sudanese side, Al Ahly Shendi last month.

Modiba was given the chance for a professional contract at Mpumalanga Black Aces after starring for the Ke Yona Team in 2014 and moved to SuperSport at the start of this season.
