NMMU Madibaz set their sights on becoming the first homegrown team to compete in the professional ranks in three decades when they eased towards winning the Safa-NMB SAB League by a record points margin on Sunday.

Meanwhile, it is down to the wire in the race for the runnersup berth.

Golden Aces, the favourites to finish second, beat Highland Spurs 2-1 on Saturday only to go down 5-2 against Motherwell Academy on Sunday.

The loss opened the door for Fairview Rovers, who thrashed Showvillage United Brothers 3-0

With a match in hand, Rovers are four points behind Aces. Mabayibone Strikers, the lead-
