Thanda back in the big league

BIG-TIME football will reach Richards Bay for the first time next season after Thanda Royal Zulu confirmed their promotion to the Absa Premiership with a 2-1 home victory over Stellenbosch FC at the Umhlathuze Sports Complex yesterday.

Goals from Khotso Malope and Michael Gumede took Thanda out of reach of secondplaced Black Leopards in the standings. With three rounds left to play, Amabhubesi are 13 points clear and cannot be overhauled by the Limpopo

Thanda's 15th win of the

season, in which they've lost once, returned them to the PSL following an eight-year absence.

It's a significant turnaround for the coastal unit, who were almost relegated to the third tier of local football last season.

However, the management kept faith with coach Roger Sikhakhane who oversaw an unbeaten run of 16 games, until their defeat at University of Pretoria earlier this year.

All going well it could be four KZN teams in the top flight, if AmaZulu or Royal Eagles, or even both teams, qualify for the play-offs.

However, AmaZulu and Eagles will need Stellenbosch and Leopards to drop further points in order to overtake them over the remaining three rounds.
