Dlangalala not feeling the pressure as Royal Eagles extend winless run

ROYAL Eagles Interim coach Zipho Diangalala has insisted he is not feel-ing under pressure despite a winless five-game run in the National First Disdson

Division.

The Pletermaritzburg side have struggled to shake their inconsistencies this season, with their last win stretching back to October 14 against Mthatha Bucks.

Their 2-2 draw away to Tshakhurna Tsha Madzivhandila at the weekend further highlighted their issues in defence, which took their overall num-

Eagles cancelled out the Limpopo outfit's opening goal with a brace from striker Levy Mashlaine in the 57th and 68th inhities respectively. However, the home side managed to rescue a point heading into stoppage time. Speaking to The Witness yesterday, Dlangalala offered no excuses for his side's poor defending in the second half.

"We started well. The boys showed an intent to win the game but again it wasn't to be. We conceded, equalised, went ahead and conceded

again.

"Things didn't go our away, Unfortunately, it was one of those games where the dominating possession did not make the difference.

"But, overall I'm extremely happy with the boys. They managed to score goals and get themselves back in the game. Now, we just need to get better," he said.

The Midlands outfit find themselves in 14th position in the standings with 11 points from 12 games, which has left the S3-year-old tactical racing the prospect of the sack. He said: "We have a lot of quality

suits. We have to move forward and learn from our mistakes, but for them to do so, they need to be sharp upfront and also solid at the back." Diangalala said.

Looking ahead, they will now prepare for an unpredictable visit from Black Leopards this Saturday, with being in high spirits following their 2-1 win over Super Eagles on the weekend.

Diangalala added: "It's back to the drawing board. No one wants to lose and we are treating every team with the same respect.
