



Dipsy shares secrets of Celtic's new coach Veselin

Ex-Botswana striker backs Serbian to succeed in PSL

New Bloemfontein Celtic coach Veselin Jelusic is the real deal, says former Botswana international Dipsy Selolwane.

Veselin, who has signed a two-year deal with Phunya Sele Sele, is relatively unknown in South Africa though he coached Botswana for eight years from 2002.

When Celtic announced the Serbian as head coach last week, some even poked fun at his name.

Social platform Twitter was abuzz with football followers comparing his name to popular petroleum jelly brand, Vaseline, the ointment.

Selolwane, who worked with Jelusic in the Botswana team, shed some light on his former mentor. "Before he came to Botswana, he was with the Angolan

national team. He actually coached [Mochudi] Centre Chiefs for a short time and disappeared, but came back to coach [Botswana]. He was there for some time and I think around 2008 he went to head the youth and left after that," said Selolwane, now a Cosafa Cup ambassador.

Selolwane predicted that Jelusic would have a successful stay in Bloemfontein.

"I think he's an amazing man before being a coach and in terms of football, I hope he can add value to the club."

The former Santos and University of Pretoria midfielder-cum-striker said the Celtic players will be on their toes with Jelusic in charge.

"He is an army guy. Most of the Yugoslavian guys are big on discipline and hard work," he said. Selolwane further said that Jelusic is the kind of coach who has vision and cares a lot about individual players.
