



- Cape Town All Stars have snapped up striker, Danian Wareley, from Western Cape ABC Motsepe League outfit, The Magic FC. The club announced, "We're happy for our top scorer to get another chance to play professional football when a lot of people had given up on him." The 29-year-old was once on the books of Ajax Cape Town.
- Goalkeeper, Gershin Kock, who has been released by Cape Town City, is currently training with Milano United. "It was a nice experience training everyday with Shu-Aib Walters and I also learnt lots from our goalkeeper coach, Calvin Marlin," he told Soccer Laduma.
- Former national U23 goalkeeper,

Ricardo Goss, has joined Real Kings from Lamontville Golden Arrows. "He wanted more game-time," said a source.

- Right back, Samkelo Dladla and left back, Nkosiyabo Xakane, previously with Milano United and FC Cape Town respectively, are on trial at NFD newcomers, Uthongathi FC. This news was confirmed by their agent, Kennie Chishimba. "I've also sent them Lesley Aya Peterson, a young talented centre back from my Evolution Soccer Academy," he said.
- University of Pretoria have signed a new deal with their striker, Chemon Petersen, who netted six goals last

season. "I'm thrilled," he told Soccer Laduma.

- Stellenbosch FC, who, according to various sources, have allegedly cut costs massively, are set to make an announcement on 15 July. "The club will be releasing a full statement regarding technical staff and changes to the structure. We are currently looking at one or two alternative venues because renovations to the Coetzenberg Stadium might only be completed by February 2018," said head coach, Steve Barker.
- Acornbush United left back, Sbonelo Ngubane, was sent to Ama-Tuks for evaluation but allegedly was

asked to leave. "They interviewed him about intermediary representation, then offered to get an agent in order that the club could sign my player," claims his disgruntled agent, Nathi Khuzwayo.

- Roscoe Krieling, formerly Sammy Troughton's assistant at Stellenbosch FC, is possibly going to sign for Igugu Lekapa following the sudden departure of Brandon Truter to Royal Eagles. "As it stands, I'm still free," said Krieling.
- Despite interest from various PSL clubs, including Kaizer Chiefs, Royal Eagles fullback Karabo Litabe looks likely to remain at the big-spending

NFD outfit. According to a reliable source, the 23-year-old's family are putting pressure on him. "Karabo's father wants his son to stay in Pietermaritzburg. The only other possibility is that Platinum Stars could sign him," said a source.

- Former Royal Eagles' GM, Richard Makhoba, has joined Thanda Royal Zulu as their new CEO, although the club has changed its name to Richards Bay FC now that the AmaZulu deal has been finalised. Although he confirmed his appointment to Soccer Laduma, at this stage it is not known what the future role of his predecessor, Sifiso 'Jomo' Biyela, will be. "I am the CEO," said Makhoba.
