buntu Cape Town FC coach Roger Links was happy to get away with a point following their 1-1 draw away to Real Kings on Saturday and urged his team to start winning their home games to ensure they maintain their National First Division status at the end of the season.

"We are a new team and our main priority is to maintain our status," said Links after the match at Sugar Ray Xulu Stadium in Clermont, outside Durban.

Surprise Bhengu opened the scoring a minute before half-time but Range Chivaviro cancelled it out in the 65th minute, earning his side a valuable point.

"I am proud of my team. They showed a lot of character. We had to have guts to get something out from this game. Kings are on a good run and I am happy with the point," said Links.
