HIGHLANDS Park could be declared the 2017-18 National First Division (NFD) champions today without even kicking a ball - with a massive five matches to spare.

PSI Highlands dominate proceedings in the NFD and have opened up a gap of 15 points with five games to go. And today is the day Kings

visit stubborn Ubuntu Cape Town at Athlone Stadium (3pm), where defeat or a draw for the Durbanites could see Highlands declared champions with an unassailable 56 points. Not even victory might be enough

for Kings, currently on 38 points, to catch up with the high-riding Tembisa side, mar

straight promotion. This can be regarded as an impossible scenario, as the Tembisa side has scored 51 goals in 25 matches.

And Kings would have to win all six matches. today's game included, by six goals without

conceding to equal them on points and gain promotion due to goal difference

Even if Highlands fail to add another point to their tally, the best nearest rivals Black Leopards can do - should Lidoda Duvha win all five their remaining games - is to equal them on points. Third-placed Jomo Cosmos don't stand a chance of dethroning Sinky Mnisi's club.

Following their 4-0 thrashing of Tshakhuma Tsha Madzivhandila at the weekend, Da Gama continued playing down the notion of winning automatic promotion.

"No, we are not thinking about the PSL," he said, even though the writing is on the wall. "Our next game is against AmaTuks (University of Pretoria). It's an important match we are totally focused.

"We are grounded, anything can happen, things can turn upside down at any time. There's nothing special about us. We are working hard and that is what's keeping us going. We are not worried about who is following us."

Meanwhile, after being eliminated from the Nedbank Cup on Saturday, Ubuntu vowed to apply their cup form in the league to save them from drowning.

Ubuntu gave great displays in Ke Yona, eliminating two Absa Premiership sides in Polokwane City and AmaZulu on debut, before being knocked out by FS Stars 4-2 on penalties after a 1-1 draw.
