But, while they have one foot in the Premiership, the same cannot be said about the other end of the table.

The focus has been more on the play-offs spots - teams that finish second and third - but the real battle is at the bottom of the log, where as many as six teams are fighting for survival.

Only 10th-placed University of Pretoria seem to be safe from relegation after they reached the 30-point mark - which is usually

At the same time, Richards Bay have not recovered from selling their Premiership status to AmaZulu at the beginning of the season.

After winning last season's campaign as Thanda Royal Zulu, Bay sold their status, but now find emselves fighting for survival. th Another side in danger of going down is Royal Eagles, which always promise so much but deliver so

little on the field. Despite chopping and changing coaches, Eagles find themselves 13th on the log. Their hopes lie in their latest coach, Roger Sikhakhane, who led

Thanda to promotion last season. But it is also happening at the top, where nine sides are vying to book a place in the play offs. Two places are reserved for the promotional play offs for clubs finishing second and third, which will fight it out with the 15th-placed

Absa Premiership side. With seven matches to go, Real Kings and Tshakhuma Tsha Madzivhandila occupy the two places, but there is still a long way to go before they can secure their spots.

Tenth-placed University of Pretoria, which are six points behind third-placed Tshakhuma can still qualify for the play-offs, but their recent form does not inspire confidence. There is still a lot of football to

play and the chasing pack are licking their wounds and waiting for the right moment to strike.
