The 50-year-old became the first local

The 50-year-old became the first local coach to take charge of Chiefs in more than a decade when he was appointed at the start of the 2015/16 season, but his lack of success may lead to the club looking outside of South Africa for his replacement rather than looking inward into Mzansi. That's a decision that the club are yet to make.

The club was recently fined for the be-haviour of their supporters as they threw objects at Komphela and his players fol-lowing the 3-0 defeat to Chippa United, and that was followed by the sickening scenes at the Moses Mabhida Stadium.
