Step 1

Step 2

After your application has been submitted, it will be evaluated by the relevant faculty. The faculty will inform you whether you have been admitted.

The International Students Division (ISD) will be your contact from then on and assist you in all travel, accommodation, immigration and other matters until you arrive at UP.

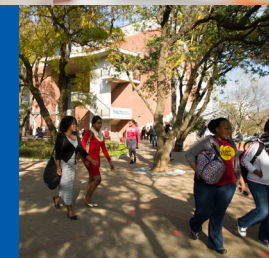

In 2014 the University of Pretoria partnered with The MasterCard Foundation Scholars Program to provide bursaries to 347 students over the next ten years. Two thirds of these bursaries are for postgraduate study with one third being for undergraduate study.

Holistic Programme Design

The MasterCard Foundation Scholars Program identifies bright young people who have demonstrated a commitment to making a difference in their communities, yet face significant barriers to accessing and completing quality education. It is uniquely designed to provide them with holistic support, including:

- Comprehensive scholarships;

- Mentoring and counselling, including academic and social support;
- Service and experiential learning (volunteerism, internships, social entrepreneurship); and
- Career counselling and connections to jobs in the scholars' home countries.

Please Note: Applications to study at UP in 2016 opens on 1 May 2015. Applications for The MasterCard Foundation Scholars Program can only be submitted after a candidate has been provisionally admitted to a study programme at the University of Pretoria.

This Program targets academically qualified, yet economically disadvantaged, young people in South Africa, SADC and the rest of Africa who will contribute to the transformation of the continent. Community service is a necessary component of the Program with all students engaging in giving back to the community from which they come.

Instructions

- In order to apply for The MasterCard Foundation Scholars Program at the University of Pretoria, you MUST have been admitted to UP and arrange to have the required supporting materials sent to the University. You will need your student number to complete the MasterCard Foundation Scholars Program Application form.
- Be sure to include documents that support what your family, or guardian, or foster parents, can afford to pay. Examples of this documentation include: bank statements, payslips, loan documents, etc.
- Only students admitted to full-time study programmes at the University of Pretoria will be considered for this Program.
- The Program is limited and applies to students who cannot afford to pay the full fees. Do not apply for funding if you or your parents, guardian or foster parents can pay the full fees.
- All the information provided must be accurate and true. Any falsification of information on this application may result in your admission to the university being withdrawn.

If you are successful, the Program will cover the following:

- Full tuition fees
- Accommodation in a UP residence
- Meals
- Books & printing materials
- A modest monthly stipend
- Medical aid (Ingwe only)
- Travel costs (one return trip for the duration of the study period)
- Visa costs – International students

Please note that the Scholars Program is for first time applicants as first year students and first year postgraduates.

- UP is a leading research-intensive University in Africa
- More than 60 000 currently registered students from Africa and further afield enrol at UP each year.
- The University has nine faculties, including the Veterinary Science Faculty on the Onderstepoort Campus, which is the only one of its kind in South Africa.

Language policy and medium of instruction

In conducting its business, the University uses two official languages, namely English and Afrikaans. In formal education the medium of instruction is either English or Afrikaans, or both of these languages, provided that there is a demand and that it is academically and economically justifiable. However, it remains the student's responsibility to ascertain on an annual basis in which language a module and any further level of that module is presented. In respect of administrative and other services, a student has the right to choose whether the University should communicate with him or her in English or Afrikaans. Where the University has the capacity, Sepedi is used as an additional language of communication.

Accommodation at UP

The Department of Residence Affairs and Accommodation (TuksRes) offers students a safe, functionally-convenient, on-campus study and living environment.
