Information Brochure for BCom Honours/Post Graduate Diploma in Accounting Sciences (07240042) and Certificate in the Theory of Accountancy (07210011)





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1. INTRODUCTION

The BCom Honours in Accounting Sciences (Hons)/Post Graduate Diploma in Accounting Sciences (PGD) and Certificate in the Theory of Accountancy (CTA) Programme presented by the University of Pretoria (UP) is accredited by the South African Institute of Chartered Accountants (SAICA) as part of its education requirements to qualify as a Chartered Accountant.

The Chartered Accountant qualification is the highest professional accountancy qualification in South Africa. A Chartered Accountant is an expert in the broad field of Accountancy that includes the following primary subject areas (disciplines): Financial Accounting, External Auditing, Financial Management and Taxation (split slightly differently in the new SAICA Competency Framework). Chartered Accountants are characterised by their multi-disciplinary approach, analytical ability and systematic and logical approach to problem solving. The successful completion of the UP Hons/PGD and CTA Programme provides a candidate with admission to the Initial Test of Competence of the SAICA (previously known as Part 1 of the Qualifying Examination).

At postgraduate level we follow a strong student-centred approach, with great emphasis on insight, understanding, application and interdisciplinary interaction. Your lecturers will manage the learning process efficiently and professionally, but the successful completion of the Hons/PGD and CTA Programme depends on your commitment. The Departments presenting the Financial Sciences strive to mould our students academically in order to become professionally educated Chartered Accountants, (CA(SA)s), and Registered Auditors.

The Hons/PGD and CTA Programme is offered on a full-time basis only.

3. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Please note that Department of Accounting reserves the right to limit the number of students admitted to the Hons/PGD and CTA Programme, taking cognisance of available capacity in respect of teaching infrastructure and human resources.

3.1 Basic requirements

- 3.1.1 Students who want to be admitted to the BComHons/PGD in Accounting Sciences and CTA in 2014, are herewith notified of the following admission requirements:
- 3.1.1.1 A candidate may be admitted to the BComHons/PGD in Accounting Sciences and CTA in 2014 on condition that he/she obtained the following marks in 2013:
 - (a) an average final mark of 57% in the following four modules: FRK 300, ODT 300, FBS 300 and BEL 300; AND
 - (b) a final mark of 55% in FRK 300.
- 3.1.1.2 A candidate who has not completed the modules as indicated in 3.1.1.1 (a) simultaneously in 2013, may be admitted to the BComHons/Post Graduate

Diploma in Accounting Sciences and CTA in 2014 on condition that he/she obtained:

- (a) a mark of 50% in the admission tests (see 3.2) written early in January 2014 for the third year modules already passed prior to 2013; AND
- (b) an average final mark of 57% in the four third year modules (see 3.1.1.1 (a) above) passed in 2013 or earlier; AND
- (c) a final mark of 55% in FRK 300 in 2013 or earlier.
- 3.1.2 Candidates who have obtained the degree BCom in Accounting Sciences from the University of Pretoria prior to 2013 (i.e. studies have been interrupted):
 - (a) Subject to selection, all candidates in this category are required to write the admission tests in all four the third year modules (BEL 300, FBS 300, FRK 300 and ODT 300) early in January 2014 and obtain a pass mark of 50% in each of the modules concerned (refer to section 3.2 for the admission tests timetable)

AND

- (b) If a candidate obtains an average mark of at least 57% for the admission tests concerned, and a minimum of 55% for FRK 300, he/she will be considered for admission to the Hons/PGD and CTA programme.
- 3.1.3 Candidates who have obtained a BCom in Accounting Sciences degree or equivalent from another university (to be assessed and approved on application to the University of Pretoria):
 - (a) Requirements 3.1.2(a) to 3.1.2(b), above, apply to all candidates in this category.

4. APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION

Please ensure that you understand the admission requirements in Section 3, above, before consideration of the application procedure in this section.

4.1 Candidates who were registered students at UP during 2013:

Candidates that are registered at UP currently (third years) will receive the departmental application form together with this brochure when it is handed out in class. The form is also available at request from Rooms 2-52.2 and 2-44, EMS Building.

The departmental application form with a passport photo attached and a copy of your ID must be handed in on or before 30 September 2013 at Mrs MJ du Toit (EMS 2-52.2) ((012) 420-2422) when you apply for selection for Hons/PGD and CTA. You should only do this **after** you have applied online for admission to UP. No application fee is payable.

Should you not hand in the departmental application form with photo attached and the copy of your identification document, as well as apply online, **you will not be considered for selection**.

You will be advised per letter or e-mail, as soon as possible after selection, on whether you have been selected or not.

All postgraduate students MUST register **online**. If you encounter any difficulty with registration, Faculty Administration will be available from Monday 6 January 2014. Should your selection not be finalised by 6 January 2014 due to outstanding admission tests, you will have to register in the week ending 24 January 2014, once your admission test results are available.

4.2 Candidates who were NOT registered students at UP during 2013 and/or candidates who studied at other universities:

These candidates must in addition to the hard copy of the (1) **departmental application form** (obtained from Ms G du Toit at 012 420 2422), (EMS 2-52.2)), also complete the (2) **official application form for admission to the University of Pretoria**. The official application form for UP is available at the Client Services Centre, or can be downloaded at www.up.ac.za/downloadpdfform, or alternatively you could apply online at http://web.up.ac.za. A complete academic record and a passport photograph must accompany the departmental application form that **MUST** be handed in at or sent to Ms G du Toit. A selection committee will evaluate and approve complete applications thereafter.

5. PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

5.1 BComHons/Post Graduate Diploma in Accounting Sciences (07240042)

This degree/diploma is the specialised honours degree/post graduate diploma for candidates who are preparing for the relevant examinations of the South African Institute of Chartered.

Compulsory modules (full-time only)

Candidates must pass the four modules mentioned above to meet the requirements for the BComHons/Post Graduate Diploma in Accounting Sciences degree.

5.2 The Certificate in the Theory of Accountancy (CTA) (07210011)

In order to be admitted to the Initial Test of Competence (ITC) of The South African Institute of Chartered Accountants (SAICA), a candidate must obtain a CTA at an accredited university.

The Certificate in the Theory of Accountancy is only awarded to graduate candidates who have passed the following modules/subjects (*in alphabetical order*) for the field of specialisation, Accounting Sciences, at the University of Pretoria (or equivalent modules accepted by the Program Coordinator CA Training):

- 1. Auditing (ODT) 200, 300, 700
- 2. Professional Ethics (BPE) 210/211
- 3. Business Management (OBS) 155
- 4. Commercial Law (KRG) 110, 120, 200
- 5. Communication Management (KOB) 183
- 6. Economics (EKN) 110, 120
- 7. Financial Accounting (FRK) 100 or 101, 201, 300, 700
- 8. Financial Management (FBS) 200, 300, 700
- 9. Industrial and Organizational Psychology (BDO) 181
- 10. Informatics (INF) 112, 264 and 281
- 11. Marketing Management (BEM) 162
- 12. Statistics (STK) 110, 120
- 13. Taxation (BEL) 200, 300, 700

Note that Financial Accounting 700, Auditing 700, Financial Management 700 and Taxation 700 must be passed at this University at the **same examination session**. For this purpose **"the same examination session"** includes the supplementary examination session immediately following the examination session. It however does not include any subsequent special examination, due to the fact that the Initial Test of Competence of SAICA is already written in January of the next year.

5.3 Test, exam and supplementary examination information (this may change for 2014)

5.3.1 Five joint **continual evaluation tests** (CEV tests) per year, (in addition to other CEV tests that Departments may introduce themselves) will be written as follows:

With exception of the first CEV test, which is in exactly the same format as the CEV tests in the third year of study, the format of CEV tests in Hons/PGD and CTA is as follows:

- CEV tests are written in 2 sessions (2 subjects per session) with a 30 minute break between the two sessions.
- Reading time of 10 minutes per 60 minute writing time is allowed during the CEV tests.
- Detail guidance will be communicated in class.
- 5.3.2 There will be three **test series**: one in April, one in July and one in September, and will be compiled as follows:
 - a. April: Four question papers with the following mark allocation: FRK 200 marks, ODT, BEL and FBS 120 marks each. The format of these papers will be communicated to you before the tests take place.

- b. July: Two consecutive days with two test sessions per day. The duration of each test session is 3 hours that consists of 30 minutes reading time and 2,5 hours writing time. A range of the mark allocations for the competencies to be tested will be announced.
- c. September: Four question papers with the following mark allocation: FRK 160 marks, ODT maximum 120 marks, BEL and FBS 120 marks each. The format of these papers will be communicated to you before the tests take place.
- 5.3.3 The **exam** will consist of 5 papers with the following mark allocation: FRK and ODT 200 marks each, BEL 160 marks, and FBS will consist of two exam papers of 100 marks each, that is written on different days.
- 5.3.4 The **supplementary exams** will be written approximately 7 days after the release of the year-end exam results. The supplementary exams will finish at the latest on 28 November 2014. The marks for supplementary exams for FRK and BEL are 120 marks each, the supplementary exam of ODT is a maximum of 120 marks, and the supplementary exam of FBS is a maximum of 150 marks.

In the case of candidates that did not pass all four modules for the degree/diploma BComHons/Post Graduate Diploma in Accounting Sciences in the year end exam session, a supplementary exam is granted for the module(s) not passed, provided the candidate achieved a final mark of at least 45% in the relevant module(s).

5.4 Recess

There will be a recess of one week, the last week of April / first week of May and a recess of approximately two weeks after the July test series.
