Denise Nicholson holds a Bachelor's degree from Unisa and LLM from the University of the Witwatersrand (Wits). She is the Scholarly Communications Librarian at Wits. She has worked in library services for 38 years, with 24 years in copyright, open access and scholarly matters. She is recognised locally and internationally for her advocacy of access to knowledge, open access and copyright awareness. In a campaign for more balanced national copyright laws she convened two copyright task teams (1998 and 2000) that prevented two proposals to amend the copyright law by the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI). Denise has contributed to the current amendment process by engaging with the DTI, presenting at workshops and Parliamentary hearings, making submissions on the Copyright Amendment Bill and working with various organisations to promote and support the Bill. She serves on numerous international and local copyright committees and has presented at many conferences around the world. She has many publications and provides online information services to over 8000 subscribers globally. She has received prestigious awards for her work and professional contribution in South Africa and abroad.
