Some leaders are effective but not very ethical, and other leaders are ethical but not very effective. The challenge of leadership is about how to do both. The interesting thing about ethics and leadership is that, unlike science and technology, the content of both topics is not new and has not really changed over time. That is why studying history offers great insights into leadership in the broader context of the human condition. In this talk I will examine why past and present leaders have found it difficult to be ethical.

### **About the Speaker**

Joanne B. Ciulla is Professor of Leadership Ethics and Research Director of the Institute for Ethical Leadership at Rutgers University. Prior to joining Rutgers, she was one of the founding faculty of the Jepson School of Leadership Studies (University of Richmond), which was the first degree-granting liberal arts school of leadership studies in the world. She also had academic appointments at LaSalle University, Harvard Business School, and The Wharton School. Prof. Ciulla held the UNESCO Chair in Leadership Studies at the United Nations University in Jordan, and has had visiting appointments at Nyenrode University, The University of Melbourne, University of Fort Hare, and Oxford University. A BA, MA, and Ph.D. in philosophy, Prof. Ciulla has dedicated most of her scholarly work to developing the field of leadership ethics and writing on business ethics. She has published 7 books and over 180 articles. She serves on the editorial boards of the *Leadership Quarterly*, *Leadership*, *Leadership and the Humanities*, and *The Business Ethics Quarterly*. Prof. Ciulla edits The New Horizons in Leadership Studies Series (Edward Elgar Ltd.). She has served as president of The International Society for Business, Economics, and Ethics and The Society for Business Ethics. Prof. Ciulla is the recipient of the Distinguished Educator Award from the University of Richmond and the Outstanding Faculty Award from the State Council of Higher Education of Virginia. In addition to teaching and academic work, she has given lectures and seminars to businesses and government agencies all over the world and has worked with the Aspen Institute, The Brookings Institution, and The World Economic Forum.
