Admission requirements

- 2. A cumulative weighted average of at least 65% for the honours degree **or** a weighted average of at least 65% at final-year level of the four-year bachelor's degree
- 3. In the case of a four-year bachelor's degree an average of 65% is required for the research component
- 4. An admissions essay/examination may be required

Note: Additional work/modules may be required in order to reach the desired level of competency

Additional requirements

Prospective students may be required to submit an admissions essay or to sit for an examination or to do additional work/modules to enable them to reach the desired level of study. An acceptable level of proficiency in English is required. An approved statement of intent is required.
