1. Relevant master's degree
or
Relevant degree from a foreign university that allows entrance to a doctoral degree (SAQA level 9)
2. An average of at least 65% for the research component at master's level
or
below 65% for the research component at master's level:
 - a. relevant work experience
 - b. other academic qualifications and
 - c. the merit of the research topic
3. A portfolio consisting of:
 - a. copy of the preceding master's research component
 - b. recent research-based essays or assignments
 - c. a letter of motivation

Note: An admissions examination may be required
