The House Theology Committee, in cooperation with our Life Abundant Bursary Fund, will provide refreshments and music.</p> <p>Dr Maniraj Sukdaven is arranging a lecture on race, class and gender within the context of inclusiveness in a workplace environment such as the Faculty of Theology and Religion and the transformation needed to address any forms of such discrimination.</p> <p>All our Departments will incorporate the theme of anti-discrimination in their modules, addressing issues such as reconciliation and racism, followed by class discussions.</p> <p>Our Centre for Contextual Ministry (CCM), will arrange a series of talks comprising brief inputs from different people on perceived discrimination based on race, gender, language, etc. The CCM will have a display where people can anonymously note their own personal experience of discrimination.
