What is Public Health Policing?

While law enforcement has a prime role in ensuring the rule of law, it rarely provides a final solution since it does not address the root causes of crime. One does not solve underlying problems by solely filling up prisons by putting even greater numbers of people behind bars. Prevention is by far more cost-effective and efficient.

To this end, a new paradigm explored is the 'public health approach'. This approach tends to view crime as a public health issue, like the spread of disease, and emphasises prevention through evidence-based early interventions and active collaboration with community stakeholders. Being piloted on multiple sites it is hoped that it will not only result in safer communities but equally improve the public's perception and trust towards law enforcement.
