
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1. The University of Pretoria



4. Minimum admission requirements

Applicants with school-leaving qualifications other than the South African National Senior Certificate (NSC) or Independent Examination Board (IEB) should meet the following admission requirements for undergraduate studies at the University of Pretoria.

4.1 Universities South Africa (USAf) exemption requirements

The first requirement to study a bachelor's degree in South Africa is a Universities South Africa (USAf) exemption. USAf coordinates and issues exemption certificates based on the prescribed requirements stipulated in the gazetted exemption regulation. All applicants who obtained a school-leaving qualification other than the South African NSC or IEB, must submit a Certificate of Complete Exemption* or Foreign Conditional Exemption obtainable from USAf.

- Subjects passed at exit level
- School qualification grading system
- Certificate of Complete Exemption* or Foreign Conditional Exemption obtainable from USAf

5. South African school-leaving certificates other than the NSC and IEB

5.1 Accelerated Christian Education (ACE)

This qualification is no longer accepted at UP.

5.2 General Education Development (GED)

South African GED graduates who graduated prior to 2019 may be considered for admission provided they qualify for an exemption certificate issued by USAf and comply with university admission requirements, as well as faculty subject requirements. South African GED graduates who graduated after 2019 cannot be considered for admission to UP as the diploma is not accredited by USAf and will not be considered for exemption. Applicants from the USA who completed the GED may apply for a Foreign Conditional Exemption certificate issued by USAf accompanied by their NBT or SAT/TOEFL/IELTS results (The Faculty of Engineering, Built Environment and Information Technology requires both).


5.3 School of Tomorrow (SOT)

This qualification is no longer accepted at UP.

5.4 National Certificate (Vocational) (NCV) Level 4

The applicant must comply with admission to a Bachelor's degree and faculty-specific requirements. Subject to institutional admission requirements, the minimum admission requirement to a Bachelor's degree programme is a National Certificate (Vocational) Level 4, issued by the Council for General and Further Education and Training. The minimum legislative requirements for admission to a Bachelor's degree include the achievement of:

- Three (3) fundamental subjects between 60% and 69% (achievement level of 5, see table below) (including English); and
- Three (3) vocational subjects from the designated list between 70% and 79% (achievement level of 4, see table below).



An applicant who holds an NCV must also meet the faculty and degree-specific requirements as in the per faculty tables from page 16. English and Mathematics (if applicable) must have been taken as fundamental subjects and must have been passed on an achievement level as indicated in the tables. Physical Sciences (Vocational subject) (if applicable) must have been passed on achievement level 4 (70–79%).

The New SAT Entrance Exam is a standardised test used for college and university admissions mainly in the United States of America. The SAT score is required by USAf for exemption purposes and UP needs the SAT scores to determine eligibility for admission at UP.

10. Medical aid

10.1 Important information for study visa holders

In terms of South Africa's Immigration Act 13 of 2002, non-South African citizens who are holders of study visas, or wish to apply for study visas, must have medical aid cover for the duration of their stay in South Africa. Ensure that the medical aid is registered with the Council for Medical Schemes in South Africa. Before applying for study visas, students registering for studies at the University on study visas can apply online for medical aid cover accepted by UP. For any student who enters South Africa on a study visa without the required medical aid cover, it is recommended that he/she joins Momentum Health (Ingwe option) or any medical aid listed at the following link:

NOTE: Some South African Consular Offices, where students apply for study visas, accept international medical insurance submitted by students applying for study visas. However, the University of Pretoria requires full-degree students, exchange students and study-abroad students to join a South African medical aid registered with the Council for Medical Schemes in South Africa, and to be able to provide proof of membership for the full year, January to December. International insurance is not accepted. Students who fail to adhere to this stipulation will be obliged to join Momentum Health (Ingwe option) on campus

upon arrival, before being allowed to register. A student visiting South Africa for a period shorter than 90 days and entering on a visitor's visa is exempted from this rule.

12. Temporary residence permits

All foreign nationals wishing to enter South Africa will have to adhere to the New Immigration Regulations. The New Immigration Regulations of 2014 were published in Government Gazette No 37679 in terms of section 7 of the Immigration Act of 2002 (Act No 13 of 2002) and came into effect on 26 May 2014. Both prospective and returning students are advised to visit www.vfsglobal.com/dha/southafrica for all the required information.

The Department of Home Affairs has announced the opening of visa and permit facilitation centres in 11 cities located in the nine provinces of South Africa. (VFS Global). Visa and permit applications will be accepted at any of these centres for assessment by the Department of Home Affairs in Pretoria.

Non-South Africans with legal residence permits can apply for visas

or permits at these centres. Citizens from countries other than South Africa** are required to hold a valid passport and a temporary residence permit, such as a study visa endorsed for study at UP. Citizens from countries other than South Africa** wishing to enter South Africa should only apply for study visas once they have received an official letter of admission. Study visas must be obtained before travelling to South Africa. First applications for study visas will no longer be accepted within the borders of South Africa.
