Design Science Research growing world-wide



Prof Alta van der Merwe recently attended the 14th International Conference on Design Science Research in Information Systems and Technology (DESRIST 2019) in Worcester, USA. The conference was attended by more or less 80 participants with world-leaders such as Al Hevner and Samir Chatterjee involved in paper presentations, workshops and posters. Design Science Research (DSR) is a relatively new research approach and the international and national community of academics using the methodology are growing. At the conference the themes included relevant topics such as DSR in HCI, DSR in Data Science and DSR in Business Analytics and Process Management.

During the July 2019 recess, the Department of Informatics was part host to a group of 40 Grade 11 and 12 learners whom attended Information Technology week.
