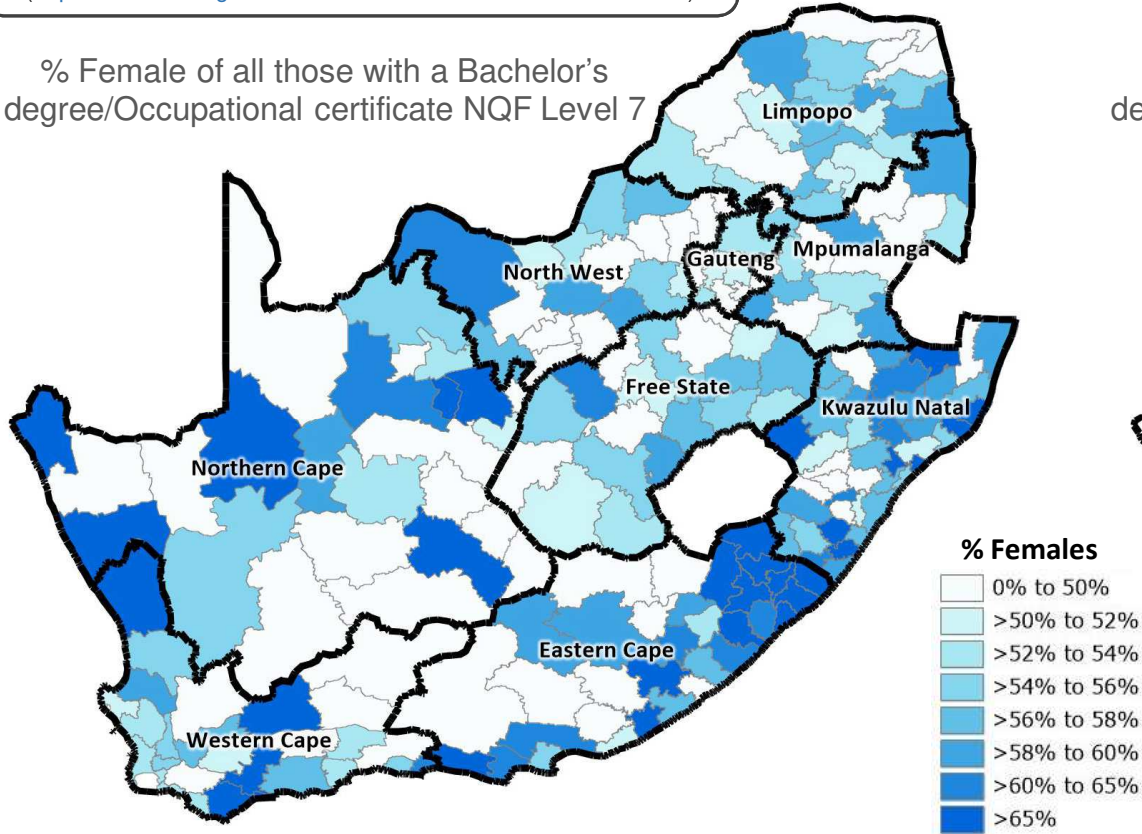

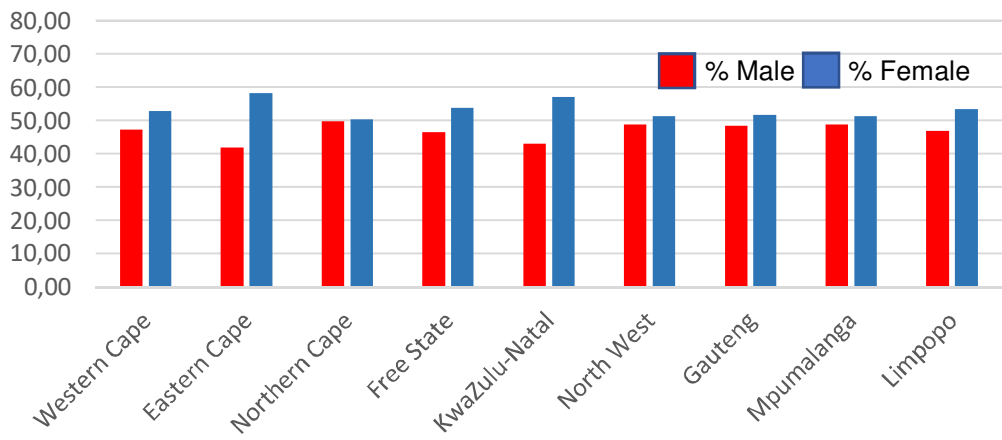
The 2016 Community Survey includes approximately 1.3 million sampled households across the country



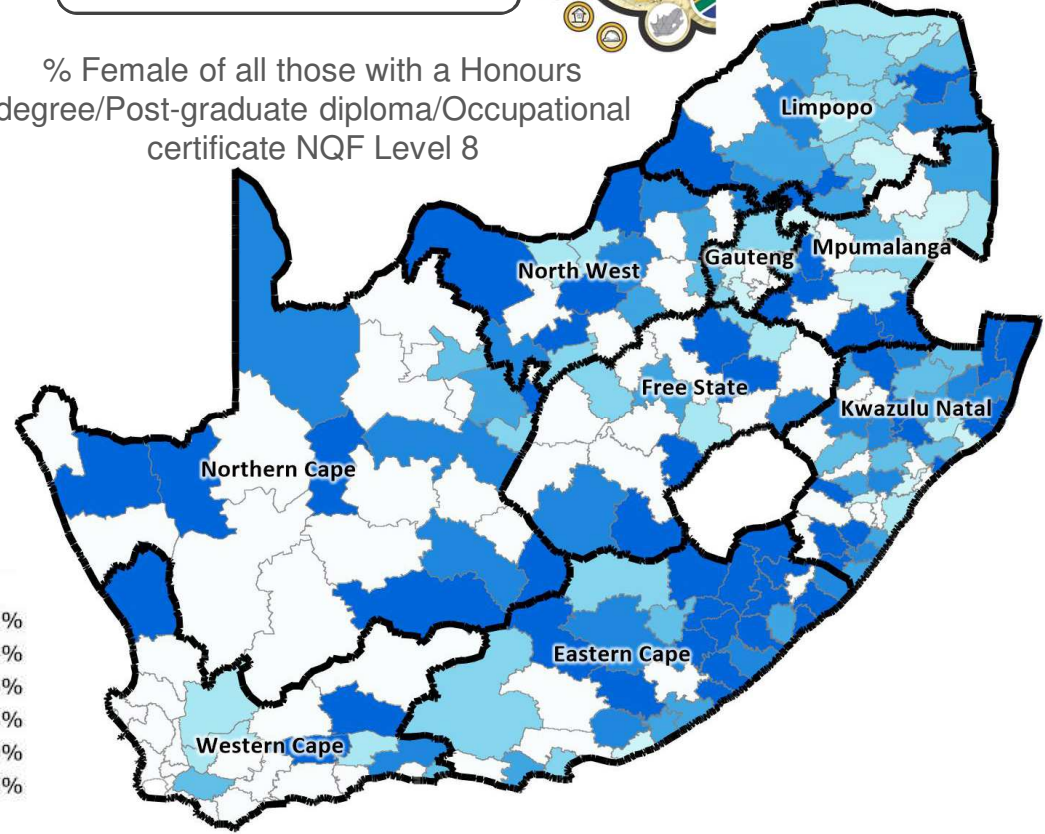
% Female of all those with a Bachelor's degree/Occupational certificate NQF Level 7



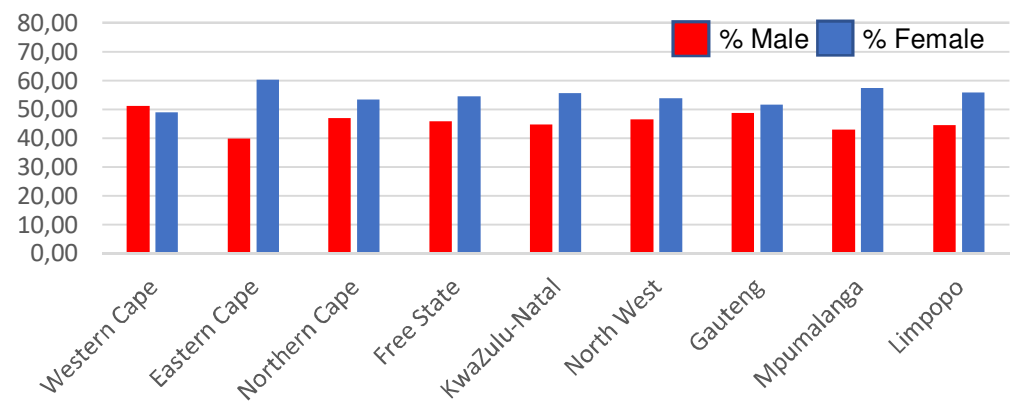
Bachelor's degree/Occupational certificate NQF Level 7



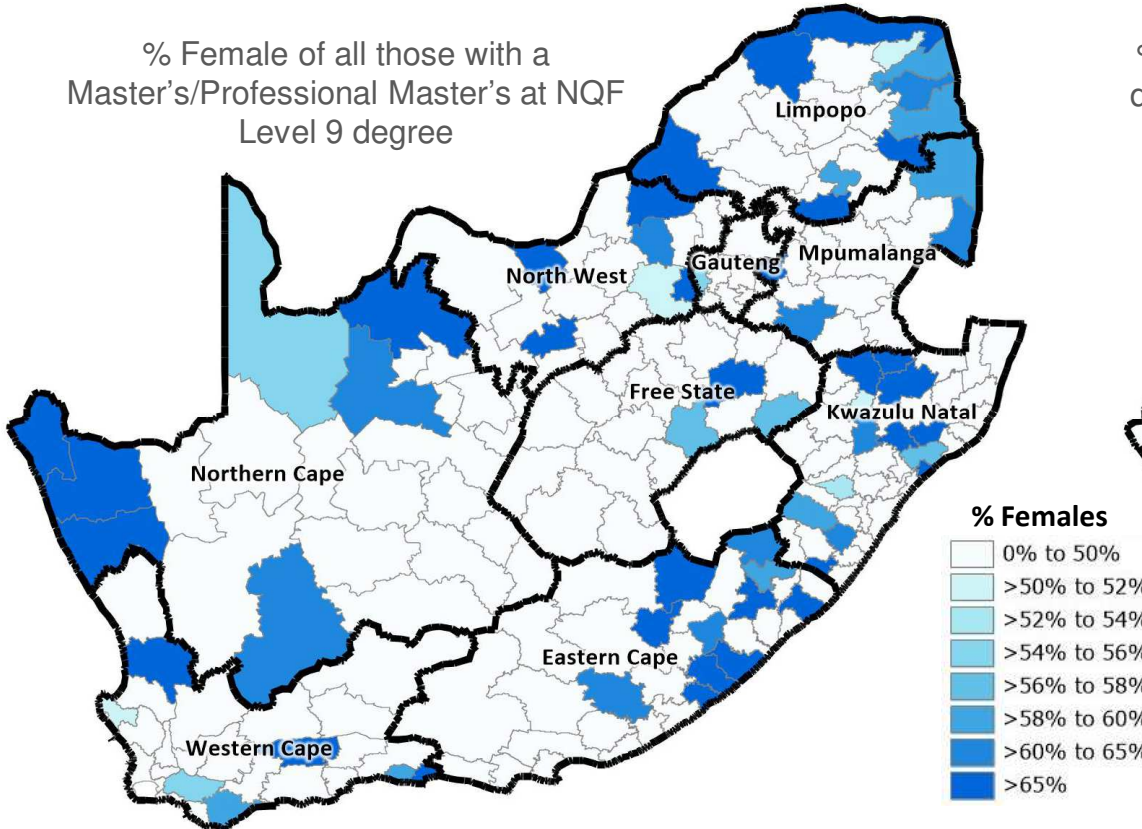
% Female of all those with a Honours degree/Post-graduate diploma/Occupational certificate NQF Level 8



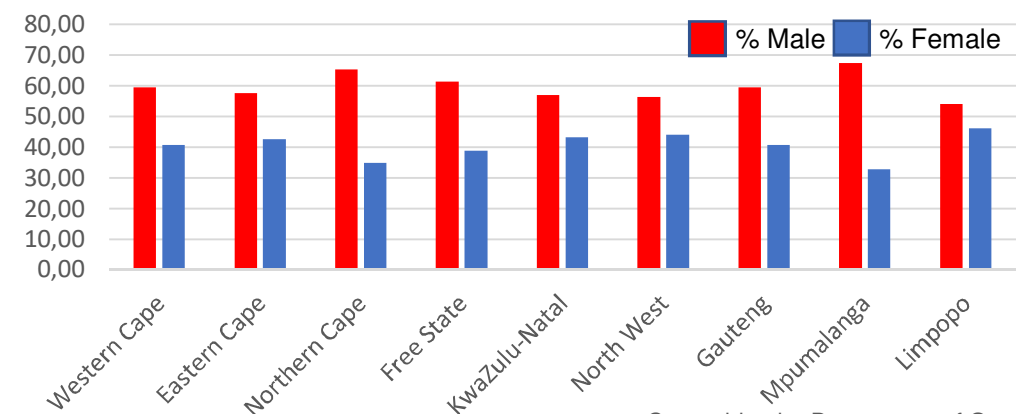
Honours degree/Post-graduate diploma/Occupational certificate NQF Level 8



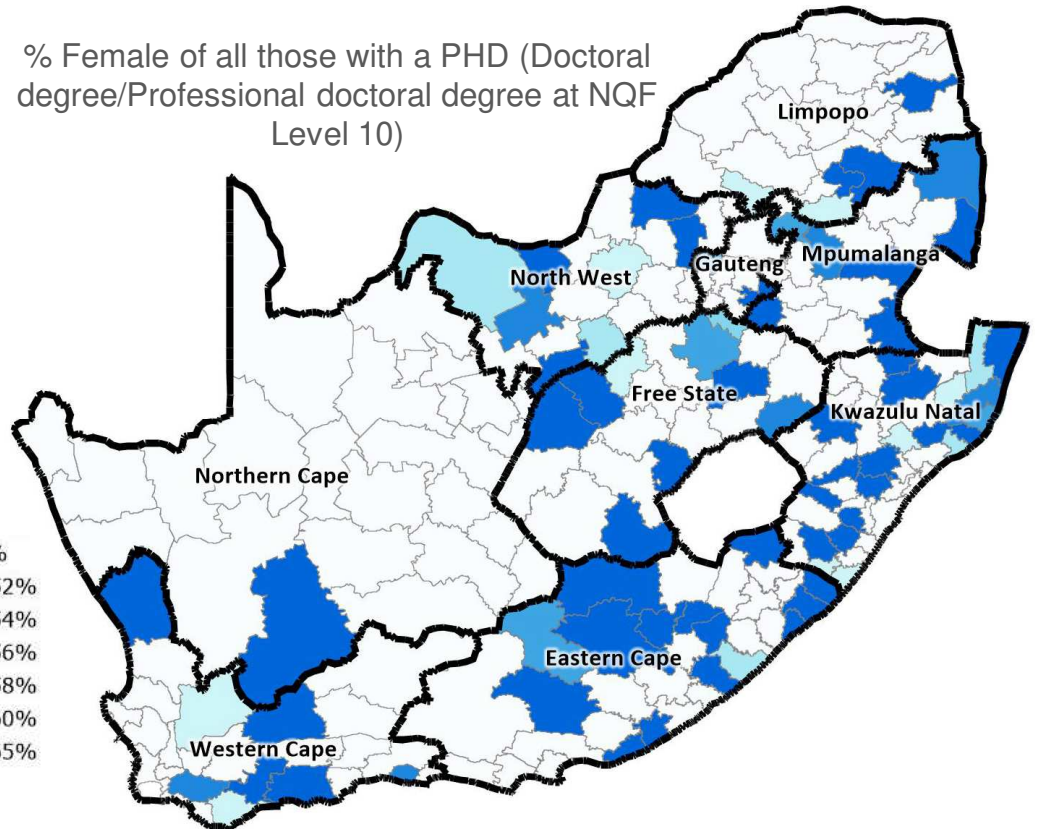
% Female of all those with a Master's/Professional Master's at NQF Level 9 degree
