## BACKGROUND OF THE STUDY

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- The University of Bagamoyo (UoB) is a newly established, it is become full fledging in 2010.
- University offers Undergraduate and Postgraduate training, comprise of academic faculties (Education, Social Science and Law).
- The University of Bagamoyo Library (UoBLib) collection comprises a physical book and university inhouse collections in two teaching complexes.

## BACKGROUND OF THE STUDY

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- In the meantime, It is thus intending to become digital by firstly adopting the hybrid concept.
- The main reason for the transformation is to increase library collections and full utilization of the existing collections.
- Pinfield et al., (1998: Hybrid Library) states that, "*The hybrid library is on the continuum between the conventional and digital library, where electronic and paper-based information sources are used alongside each other*".

## OBJECTIVE OF THE STUDY

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- The interest in pursuing study in this topic is based on the UoBLib major goal to “improve library services through the efficient utilization of inhouse collections and better information sharing”.
- The research aims at designing a repository services model suitable for Institutional Repository (IR) services at the University of Bagamoyo Library (UoBLib) environment.

## DEFINITION OF THE KEYWORD

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- Lynch (2003:327) defines Institutional Repositories (IRs) as “*a university-based institutional repository is a set of services that a university offers to the members of its community for the management and dissemination of digital materials created by the institution and its community members?*”. This document refers to IRs in the same way.

## PROBLEM STATEMENT

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- The main research question was: what type of Institutional Repository service would best suit the UoB Library environment. Underlying this main question, there are several sub questions.
- What is the potential for an IR service to:
- Reduce time spent by the library user searching for materials?

## PROBLEM STATEMENT

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- Promote improved accessibility of the library research collections?
- Improve visibility of the research outputs?
- Satisfy user needs?
- Additionally, determine the most satisfactory format for the information.

## METHODOLOGY

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- This study is an IR development strategy case study at the UoBLib in Tanzania where the qualitative approach was employed.
- This study employed a purposive sampling technique. The target comprised of ten respondents, five Academicians, three library staff and two ICT staff.
- Respondents were selected purposive b'se of likelihood being involved in IR development.

## FINDINGS

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- IRs are an alternative way to improve accessibility and visibility of the university research outputs.
- Most of the library users prefer to use information sources such as research reports, Journals and other university collections.
- It is evident that most of the library users not only want to save time when searching for information, but also retrieve what they want.

## RECOMMENDATIONS

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- Establishment of IRs systems
- DSpace software is identified as appropriate software which can be adopted by the University Library.
- Proper allocation of adequate funds and resources to the University Library is a key component to increased efficiency and improvement of Library services.

## CONCLUSION

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- There is a community of researchers in need for information to support their research needs.
- Digitization should be done with precision, including being aware that not all information in the library should be digitized.
- Although it was not the premise of this study to look at them, the issue of library policy, library staff skills and ICT technologies was also identified.
