

ADVANCED CERTIFICATE IN CLINICAL PASTORAL COUNSELLING

The questions we wrestle with when we face illness and suffering do not deserve glib answers. In a counseling context we as pastoral counsellors, ministers, social workers, nursing practitioners and lay counsellors, are confronted with our own pain as wounded healers. In this unique course you will be cushioned in find your own answers as you journey with people in their crisis of illness and hospitalization. This programme brings participants into a supervised encounter with persons in crisis. You will grow in your awareness of yourself and develop new skills, through supervision by specialist pastoral counsellors. This will equip you to deal with the story of illness as it is woven in the fabric of society. In the intimate setting of only 12 participants, theological and pastoral reflection and feedback from peers and supervisors will provide new insight and sharpen your skills as you grow in your interpersonal and professional competence.

The programme will pave the way for successful participants to apply for the designation of **Advanced Religious Professional in Christian Pastoral Counselling** from the **Council for Pastoral and Spiritual Counsellors** (75 hours practical work and 30 hours supervision). Students who qualify can also offer this course as part of a *structured course work for an Honours or Masters degree in Practical Theology at the University of Pretoria.*

Themes:

- The role of spirituality in multi-professional "whole person care"
- Functioning of the multi-disciplinary team (pastoral, medical, nursing, social work, psychology)
- The identity, personal and spiritual growth of the pastoral counsellor (including self-care and burnout)
- Theological perspectives on illness, healing, death and suffering
- African perspectives on illness and healing
- Spiritual and pastoral counselling scope of practice, diagnoses and treatment plan
- Advanced pastoral counselling practices
- Specialized care and counselling (medical emergency, the ICU environment, chronic and terminal illness, major surgery, disability, death, loss and grief, organ transplants, neo-natal care, psychiatric illness, supporting families and staff support and debriefing

Facilitators include professionals from the fields of clinical pastoral counselling, medicine, nursing, social work and psychology.
