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BRIEF DESCRIPTION

The course, **'Faith communities and missional leadership'** is designed to help participants develop a 'holy discontent' with the way things currently are. It helps participants to read their contexts well, to engage the current paradigms shaping the ministry responses of congregations and faith communities, and to foster a posture that listens well to the voices, longings and aspirations of local contexts and faith communities.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

This is a one-year programme with five weeks of contact tuition. Written assignments are done after every intensive week to be submitted before the next intensive contact week. Each module will consist of theory, practical exercises, in–depth reflection and integration of information. In the final week participants present an integrative paper with a proposal for their missional praxis.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

The purpose of this course is to nurture Christian leaders in faith communities,

- to reflect critically and discern well on their own vocation in relation to their contexts,
- to integrate their own narratives and spiritualities, with an understanding of their institutional and contextual environments,
- to engage in hopeful, innovative and transforming ways with their communities and contexts,
- using certain insights, tools, resources and capacities.
