Dr Kobie Boshoff is a senior lecturer at the Occupational Therapy Program, University of South Australia, and is a research group leader within the International Centre for Allied Health Evidence (iCAHE). In the occupational therapy field, she has a broad range of clinical experience in paediatrics and employment for people with disabilities. She has worked in South Africa, Canada and Australia. Her research is focussed on early childhood development, especially at a service planning level and includes evidence-based practice, practice-based and multi-disciplinary research. She has presented various training and workshops on systematic reviews for professionals and postgraduate students from various health and human services disciplines.
