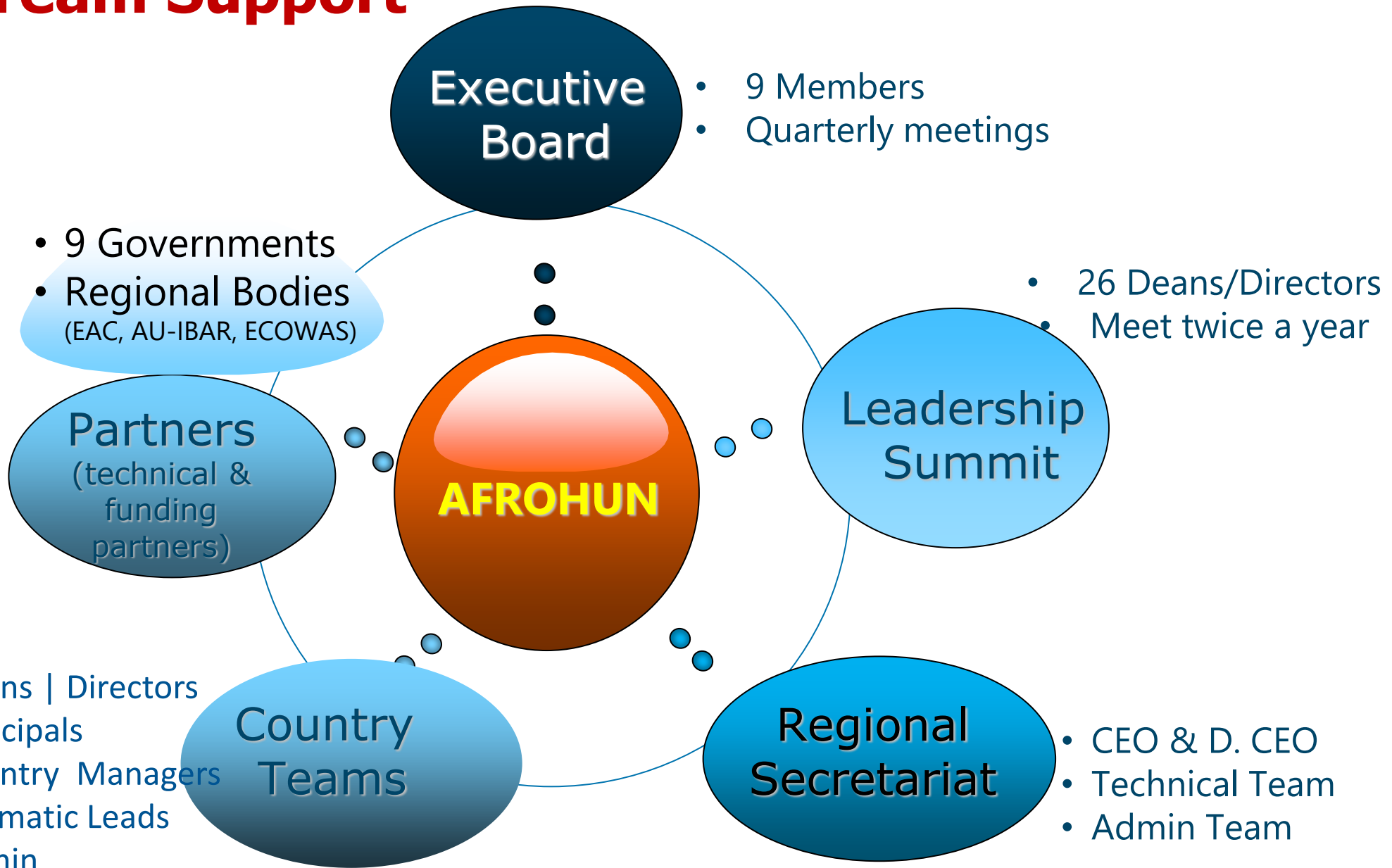

Strengthen the capacity of AFROHUN secretariat and that of network institutions to deliver one health.



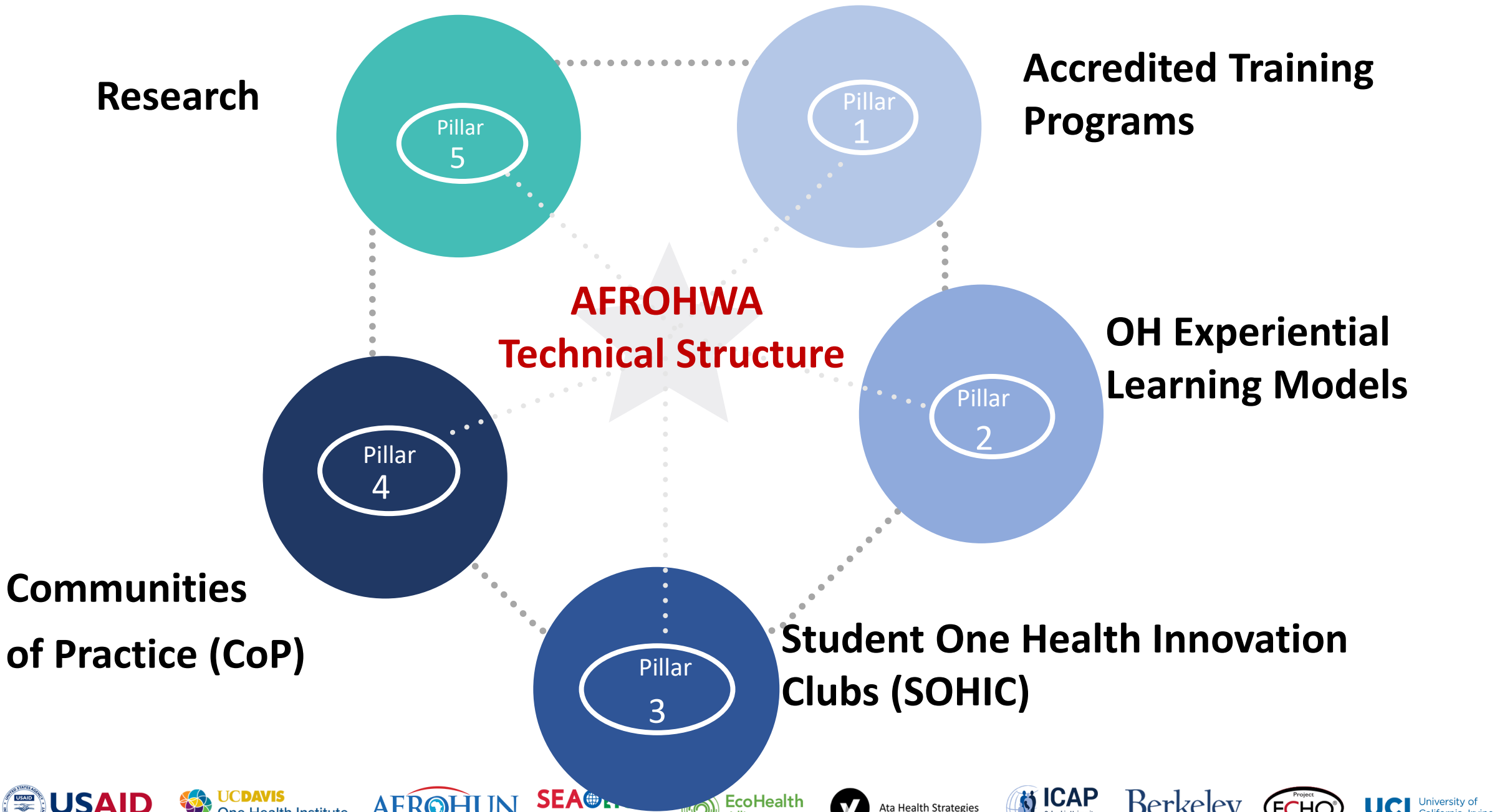
# AFROHUN's Continental Agenda

- Increasing demand for competent One Health workforce on the African continent given the increasing frequency and emergence of infectious disease outbreaks.
- OHCEA network repositioned to AFROHUN to take on a broader mandate.
- AFROHUN is pooling the strength of the network members, partners and lessons learned over 10 years into a platform to coordinate development of the continent's One Health Workforce under the umbrella of AFROHUN One Health Workforce Academy.
- The academy will be operationalized through five pillars where structured programs where trainings will be incubated, piloted and rolled out to users on the African continent and beyond.

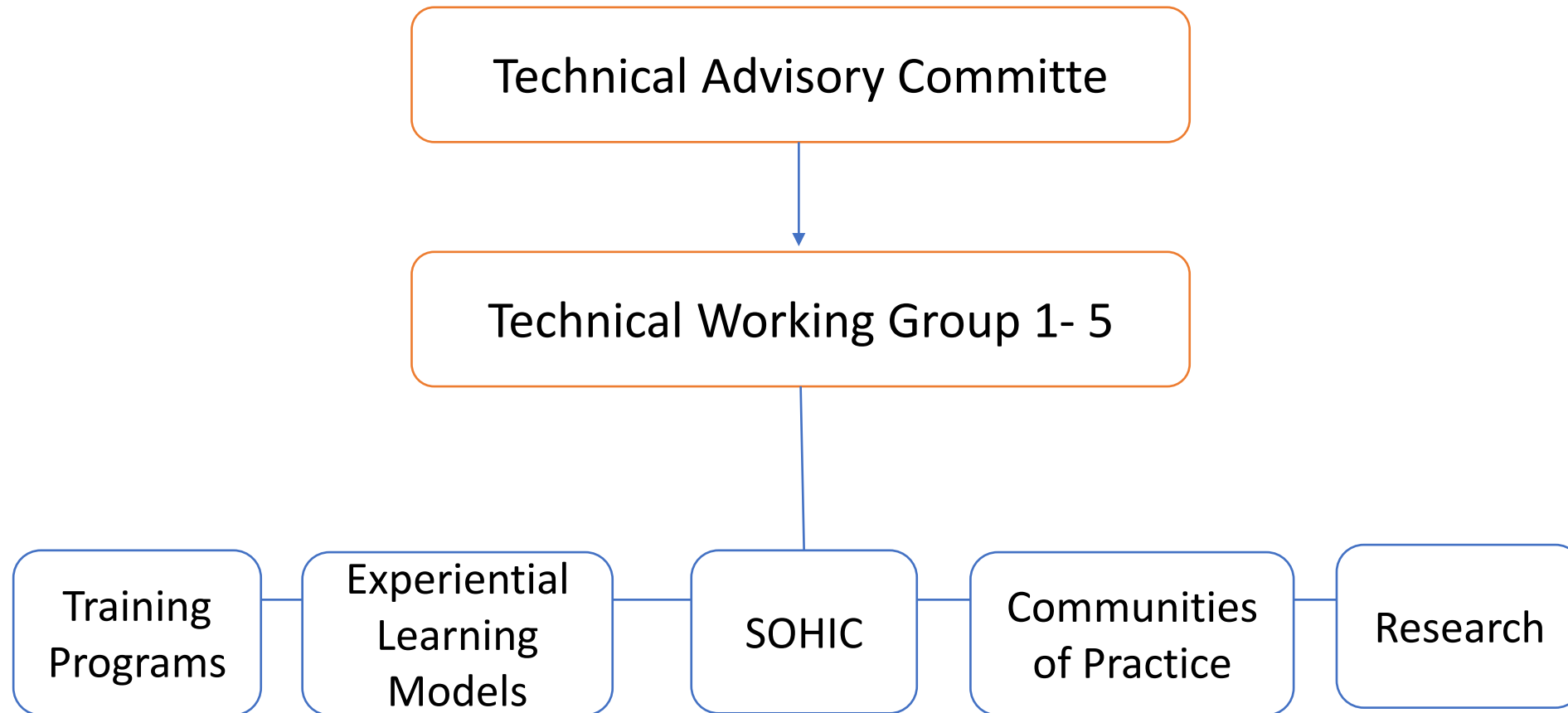

- Goal: To build the capacity of AFROHUN in workforce empowerment; workforce assessment and organization sustainability
  
- **USAID STOP Spillover Project** Goal: To enhance local, national and regional capacity to understand the ecosystem of zoonotic viral spillover and design interventions to reduce their risk, amplification, and spread.
