





Series Overview – Liesel Ebersöhn

It is increasingly becoming clear that a OH approach has stimulated modern societies to rapidly adopt measures to:

- save lives (humanitarian),

- protect livelihoods (social dynamics and human solidarity), and

- safeguard nature (ecosystem red lines) to reduce the risk of future pandemics (resilience, preparedness, precaution).
