The focus of the Future Africa project is on the UNICEF Generation Unlimited Outcome Area 4: “Covid-19 and other Emerging Science for Society Outcomes”

It specifically incorporates the One Health (OH) concept of:

- a collaborative, multi-sectoral, and transdisciplinary approach
- working at the local, regional, national, and global levels –
- with the goal of achieving optimal health [and well-being] outcomes
- recognising the interconnection between people, animals, plants and their shared environment.

1.1.3 Series Overview – Liesel Ebersöhn

It is increasingly becoming clear that a OH approach has stimulated modern societies to rapidly adopt measures to:

- save lives (humanitarian),
- protect livelihoods (social dynamics and human solidarity), and
- safeguard nature (ecosystem red lines) to reduce the risk of future pandemics (resilience, preparedness, precaution).
