

Tim Rupert is a Professor in the Accounting Group of the D'Amore-McKim School of Business at Northeastern University in the USA. He also has an appointment as Extraordinary Professor in the Department of Accounting, University of Pretoria, South Africa. He received his B.S. in Accounting and his Master of Taxation from the University of Akron. He also earned his Ph.D. from Penn State University. His research interests include taxpayer and investor decision making and tax compliance. Professor Rupert's research has been published in such journals as *The Accounting Review*, *The Journal of the American Taxation Association*, *Behavioral Research in Accounting*, *Advances in Taxation*, *Advances in Accounting Education* and *Journal of Accounting Education*. He has served as the co-editor of *Advances in Accounting Education* (2011–2017) and is currently one of the lead editors for Prentice-Hall's *Federal Taxation* textbook series as well as an editor for *The Journal of the American Taxation Association*. He is a recipient of the Outstanding Educator Award from the Massachusetts Society of CPAs. He has also received the University's Excellence in Teaching Award and the D'Amore-McKim School of Business' Best Teacher of the Year award multiple times. He is active in the American Accounting Association and has served as president, vice president and secretary of the American Taxation Association.
