## Usual suspects are the favourites to win netball title

The Gauteng Jaguars, who finally won the league in their fourth attempt last year are definitely going to be one of the top teams to challenge for the honours as they defend their title. They beat the North West Plames 49.43 in the final in Bloemfontein last year to be crowned champions. It was the first time a team other than the Free State Crinums lifted the prestigious trophy since the tournament started in 2014.
