SOUTH African rugby fans will have to wait a while before they see an Impi running out ahead of a Test on local soil again. But this weekend a new Impi will

look to establish himself as a rugby warrior – and he'll do so in Dubai. Impi Visser is the only debutant in coach Neil Powell's BlitzBoks squad for the opening leg of the 2018/19 World Sevens Series, and like any newbie, the 23-year-old wants to make the most of his shot on the Sevens circuit.
