

UP-TUKS

UP-Tuks' 2019 season can be best summarised as one of the best all round performances by any first team of the University in recent times.

The team made its presence felt in all the competitions in took part and won all but one of the championship titles up for grab.

VARSITY CUP

There was a huge improvement on 2018, when UP-Tuks only won two of its seven pool matches and had its worst performance record since the competition started way back in 2008.

With Nollis Marais taking charge again as head coach it was to be expected that UP-Tuks will not be the push over of the previous season despite the fact that the squad lacked depth and game breaking skills in key positions.

The team went from strength to strength in the pool stage and only lost one to Maties. Beating NWU 24-18 in the semi-final secured a place in the final that took place in the Danie Craven Stadium in Stellenbosch. Maties won 34-18 and became the first university to claim the coveted Varsity Cup championship title for the fourth time.

Afterwards in the change room Marais told his team in rugby there will be times when you have to concede that you were beaten by a better team: "Today you gave it your all, but in the end it was just not enough. Losing to this formidable Matie side is no shame and you have every right to walk tall when you get out of here."

VOLCANO INTER-PROVINCIAL COMPETITION

UP-Tuks were unstoppable in this competition and the 50-26 win against Naka Bulle in the final was a fitting conclusion to a season in which there was never any doubt to what team set the pace from start to finish. UP-Tuks ended the season with an unbeaten record and winning percentage of 97. UP-Tuks won 15 of their 16 matches with the draw against Centurion in the pool stage the only blemish.

In the 2nd as well as in the 3rd League competitions both our teams were the teams to beat and it showed as well when both the teams were crowned Champions of their respectful leagues against Naka Bulle (2nd's) and QBR (3rd's).

Our U/20 Pumas also showed that they had the team to win the league. They won the U/20 B league competition.

CARLTON LEAGUE

The Blue Bulls' in house competition again formed part of the Volcano Cup series. UP-Tuks won the Lucas Strachan Shield as winners of the first round and defended their title successfully by beating Naka Bulle 29-19 in the Carlton Cup 'final'.

USSA CHAMPIONSHIPS

This annual tournament took place in Stellenbosch in July. Second seated UP-Tuks made it to the final by beating NWU and Wits. This ensured a repeat of the 2018 final when Maties took UP-Tuks to the cleaners. Like then, Maties were the overwhelming favourites and it was never of question of if they will win, but only with what margin. Surprise, surprise then when UP-Tuks caught Maties completely off guard with a magnificent performance of guts, big match temperament and character. UP-Tuks beat all the odds and took gold with a nail-biting 19-18 win.

SEVENS

Men: Tuks retained their championship title at the USSA tournament in Margate, beating UJ in a closely contested final. At the Varsity Sport tournament, Tuks had less success and relinquished their 2018 crown by not making the final. They lost to Maties in the semis.

Ladies: Tuks made a clean sweep at both the USSA and Varsity Sport Tournaments. They beat Fort Hare in both finals.

TUKSFRANCHISERUGBY (Internal League)

The franchise League consists of eight different Franchises where 22 teams played in the three leagues. This creates the opportunity for more players to play rugby and to be seen by the TuksRugby Coaches. If this step was not taken, a lot of players would have been lost to TuksRugby in 2019.

Maroela represented the University in the FNB REZ RUGBY Championships this year. After a good win in the 1st round, Maroela unfortunately lost in the Semi-finals against Patria from NWU (Partia went on to win the Championship).

The Franchise league started in middle April this year and the finals took place on Tuesday 27 August.

Mopanie for the 4th time in a row was crowned the Champions of the U/20 League. AOB won their first Trophy when they ran out as winners of the 2nd league.

The 1st league final was once again a showpiece of excellent student rugby! With many supporters watching from the stands and from the sidelines Mopanie hoisted the trophy to be crowned winners of the 2019 1st team league.

There is a lot of talent regarding rugby players in the Franchise league! And with the new plan to start the league in Feb 2020, the Tuks Coaches will have the oppportunity to come and watch the games and find extra players for the squads for the Carlton and Volcano leagues.

We know that the 2020 season will be an even better year for Franchise league rugby!

DELTADRONE TUKSWOMENSRUGBY

The DeltaDrone TuksWomensRugby 7's team played in their 10th consecutive Dubai 7's tournament and the results are as follows:

The team finished 6th out of 16 teams and the following players played outstanding rugby: Libbie Janse van Rensburg, Jackie Kriel and Andrea-Maria Atomi.

Friendly games were played against the

University of Bordeax during the first quarter of the year and Tuks won two of the three games played against Bordeaux.

Once again our team travelled to Europe where they played in the following tournaments:

CENTRALÈ 7'S IN PARIS, FRANCE, 8-9 MAY 2019, where they placed 4th overall after the tournament.

STANISLAS 7'S IN NANCY, FRANCE, 11-12 MAY 2019: Tuks placed 6th.

In the **BENIDORM 7'S IN SPAIN, 25-26 MAY 2019**, Tuks finished as runners-up in the tournament.

STUDENT WORLD GAMES – FISU, NAPOLI 5-7 JULY 2019:

Eight Ladies from the Tuks Women's rugby side represented South Africa at the Student World games. Riaan van der Merwe was also the Head Coach of the Team:

Libbie Janse van Rensburg (Captain), Meghan Phillips (Vice-Captain), Kemisetso Baloyi, Sunè Botha, Sancha van Niekerk, Shania Swart, Nadine Roos and Liske Lategan.

The German National Women's Team ended TuksWomen's winning streak of 17 victories. In the past three years that Tuks competed in the Oktoberfest 7s, they had won 13 games without conceding a point. Tuks had to be content with the runners-up title for the 2019 OKTOBERFEST 7'S IN MUNCHEN, GERMANY, 21 SEPTEMBER 2019.

The TuksWomen's team walked away as champions at the USSA 7'S AT THE UNIVERSITY OF JOHANNESBURG, 28 SEPTEMBER 2019, the VARSITY 7'S, 4-5 OCTOBER 2019 as well as the ZABAVA 7'S, QUINS, PRETORIA, 12 OCTOBER 2019.

TUKSYOUTHRUGBY

TuksYouthRugby has again had a very successful season and thanks need to go to the TYR committee as well as the coaches who all do this for the love of the game and without any compensation. Teams from U/7 to U/13 played in the BBYRA primary school club "league" and over 200 children and 30 coaching personnel took part. In the High School club "league" we field teams from U/14 to U/19 (must be a scholar). Two girls teams, U/16 and U/18 also took part this year.

As in the past, the season started on the first Saturday in May with clinics. The clinics were again very sought after and we had numerous players from other clubs attending.

15 players across five age groups were selected to represent the BBYRA in the 2019 Inter Provincial Tournament that will be held in Alberton this year. Three coaches were also chosen to accommodate the players as well as two Tuks committee members will attend the IPT as Exco for BBYRA.

TUKSRUGBYLEAGUE

TuksRugby league again registered two teams to participate in the senior division (1st division) in Gauteng. This is now the 3rd year in history of South African Rugby league that the TuksRugby League could fulfill this commitment.

Both Tuks teams did well during the season and qualified for the national play-offs (semis). TuksRugby League BLUES won their semifinal 44-26 against the Bears, while the TuksRugby League REDS won their semifinal 44-24 against the Pretoria Bulls.

It was again a unique record that our two TuksRugby League teams played in the Gauteng Club finals where the REDS came out on top 52-22.

At the Club Champs TuksRugby League REDS showed they are the best by claiming the crown as the SARL TOP CLUB for 2018-2019.

Many TuksRugby League players represented

the Northern Bulls in the STATE OF REGION COMPETITION, and with the help of the TuksRugby League players the Northern Bulls won the Final 52-34.

With the Inbound International Tour side from Australia coming to SA many of the players from the TuksRugby League side was chosen to play against the team from Australia.

Lastly the committee of the TuksRugbyLeague consists of the following people: Jacques Prinsloo (Chairman), Fanie Bredenhann (Director of Rugby) and Andre Coetzer (Club Manager).

TUKSWHEELCHAIRRUGBY

TuksWheelchairRugby has shown significant growth in 2019, and the club is positioned 3rd in the South Africa Wheelchair Rugby League competition, ending on the 26th October 2019. TuksWheelchairRugby (TWCR) trains at the Rembrandt hall twice per week, making provision for new athlete development on the Thursday evening sessions.

There has been an increase in members since the start of 2019, student participation however remains a concern, even after efforts to create awareness with the Tuks Disability Unit.

TuksWheelchairRugby hosted a Wheelchair Rugby League Development event, with the aim to develop Wheelchair Rugby League in South Africa.

The event was supported by SARLA and resulted in the development of a wheelchair rugby league program at TuksWheelchairRugby.

Wheelchair Rugby equipment is extremely expensive, and remains a huge expense for the club.

Funding to uphold club equipment and obtain consumables such as tyres, tubes, sport tape and axles remains a challenge.

TuksWheelchairRugby was donated a video camera to assist in athlete and game analysis.

TWCR was featured in a television broadcast "Beyond Boundaries" on Sunday 1st September 2019 as well as newspaper articles during the year.

BLUE BULLS TUKSRUGBY ACADEMY

The Blue Bulls TuksRugby Academy strive to develop and broaden the talented pool of players for the Blue Bulls and Tuks in a well-structured program. In 2019 the emphasis was on promoting a rugby driven skill and implementing a Syllabus in the following departments:

- Theoretical Models (WR levels, First Aid, Game Analysis etc.)
- Practical Models
 (7's, Playing in different leagues, coaching etc.)

The Academy entered teams in the U/20 Presidents league (played in the Semi-finals) and also entered a team in the Franchise league where we ended up Runners-up.

The coaching team of the Academy this year consisted of:

- Stephan Moolman (Team Manager) We are looking forward to a great 2020 year.

TUKSRUGBY OUTREACH

TuksRugby was approached by a Tshepiso Sport Group that is from the community to help hosting the event. Our goal was to do something active for the children on historical Youth day and to introduce them to a different sporting code.

Rugby is one of our country's biggest sporting code, but almost none of the schools in the community have it as part of the sport curriculum. All of the sport Educators was willing to be part and also to introduce the sport into the school's curriculum.

The willingness and potential of the children makes TuksRugby hopeful to create a full- time outreach program in the near future for the community.

The TuksRugby outreach program received a

sponsorship late last year and provide equipment and playing kit for the Nantus Primary school. The school prospect and grown the rugby program with four boys attending the Blue Bulls Primary school trails at Cornwall Hill College.

TuksRugby Outreach program didn't do much this year because of the lack of funds but is busy planning to grown the program next year by:




