Women's sport is currently at the forefront and Varsity Cup has jumped on this trend by introducing the first ever FNB Varsity Cup Women Competition. This competition will see a 'super-bowl' like setup with the winners of each game advancing immediately to the next round. With only 5 women's teams competing in this year's tournament, there is a lot at stake to claim this first ever title.

The top 5 teams were determined based on the previous 2 years USSA 7s tournaments. FNB Maties Women will face FNB UKZN with the winners advancing directly to the semi-finals where they will meet FNB UFH. Our FNB UP-Tuks Womens team will meet FNB UL in

the first semi-final taking place the 3rd of April at the Tuks Stadium. The final of the women's competition will be played 13 April.

'This is a very exciting step for women's rugby,' says women's program coordinator, Libbie Janse van Rensburg. 'Women's rugby has made massive steps in the right

direction over the past few years and I'm proud to say that we at TuksRugby have been invested in growing the women's game.'


Player in Focus: Kyle Cyster


