The TuksArchery Winter Championships was postponed from July and will take place the weekend of 30 and 31 October and we still have our final tournament for 2021 taking place at the end of November. The qualification period for any international participation started at the beginning of October and will end with the SANAA National Championship during April next year. We want to urge our members to start shooting and competing again if they have aspirations of being included in any possible team selections that will take place should there be any sanctioned international tournament for participation.

With that said the Hyundai Junior World Archery Championships took place in Wraclaw Poland during August this year and from TuksArchery we were represented by Paul van der Merwe (u/17) and Wian Roux (u/21) in the Compound Division and Beyers de Klerk was the Team Manager for the event.

Paul was part of the u/17 compound team event that took place and the youngsters had the opportunity to shoot for the bronze medal on the finals day but unfortunately they had to bend the knee to their opponents and ended 4^{th} overall.

Shaun Anderson (W1) and Phillip Coates-Palgrave (CMO) competed at the Paralympic Games in Tokyo. They both shot well but was unable to make it through to the final rounds.

We are proud to have TuksArchery members represented in almost every national team participating internationally.



Johan van den Berg & the Friendship Tournament.

Dr Johan van den Berg was an alumni of the University of Pretoria and a respected Ophthalmologist who competed in both fencing and pentathlon. Johan attended training whenever his busy schedule allowed it and was someone that his

peers and younger fencers looked up, a perfect gentleman, who lived the ethos of the sport and a role-model of dedication, perseverance, and good sportsmanship. A humble man who sponsored athletes without the means in respect of club and competition fees – often knowing that the athlete he sponsored would probably eliminate him in DE's. Johan was instrumental in creating a 'Multi-Disciplinary Sport" (MDS) membership category to give Pentathletes a "home" at his alma-mater. Johan

tragically passed away on 30 August 2019 and after a suggestion to honour him and the attributes he exemplified, his wife and daughters (fondly referred to as "the van den Berg girls") gave permission to host an annual tournament. It was decided to call it a "Friendship Tournament" rather than a memorial tournament and after discussion with the Gauteng Fencing Association, it was agreed to host this Epeeonly Tournament as a celebration of the sport, during September of each year, to coincide with the start of spring and the new fencing season. The tournament was attended by more than a hundred fencers (both FFSA and SAMPA) and was a friendly (non-ranking) competition.

The inaugural tournament would have been held in 2020 to coincide with TuksFencing's 70th anniversary, but had to be cancelled due to the Covid lockdown. Due to further restrictions it got postponed to October 2021. Revised lockdown restrictions allowed limited spectators (33% of venue capacity) with guests representing the University, Federations, Provinces and Clubs.





Referee Accomplishment

Our head-coach, Andrei Kovrijnykh, who refereed in the semi-finals and finals of the Tokyo Olympics (Foil & Epee) has just been voted the 2nd best referee (elitist referee) after the sitting of the International Fencing Federation's (FIE) Executive Committee.
