I had the privilege to touch base with our two moms, and here are their stories.

Mom Lianè Erasmus (now Swart) studied BLC LLB and was in Magrietjie from 1991-1993. She was a Legal Advisor for several years and then became a stay-at-home-mom to her four girls. These days she is involved with upliftment projects and do volunteer work. She remembers the great socials with the men's residences. "I specifically remember one with Maroela at the Union Buildings. We sat on the steps overlooking Pretoria whilst chatting and showing off by singing our res songs." But the most fun she had was the annual treasure-hunt organised by the RagCom that took them all over Pretoria. Those were the days before cellphones. Lianè feels the core of Magrietjie has not changed. The pride of the Pink Ladies are still going strong and she is extremely proud to see her daughter participating in the all the events Magrietjie has to offer. She follows Magrietjie on Instagram and loves to see the ladies excel and enjoy student life to the fullest!

Mom Hanlie Weideman (now Phillips) was a proud Magrietjie lady from 1987-1990. She studied BSc (Agric) Plant pathology and is currently the nursery manager of a citrus nursery. She remembers the huppel, the Serrie they had by candlelight, how they proudly wore their pink and grey outfits, the freshly baked pies from the dining hall on Sunday mornings and the 'melkkos' for dinner. They also had lots of fun when it was someone's birthday when they decorated the flat - and these are some of these memories she still holds on to. She has always been proud to say that she is from Magrietjie and wanted her daughters to experience the same. She believes Magrietjie
