Procedures on Student Exchange	All nine faculties are given an opportunity to participate on any available call. Unless specifically agreed on a faculty agreement. A call is disseminated via internal mediums on the web and directly to all faculties in assisting with the selection and nomination of potential applicants. In case, of student's selection the procedure is done on merit in line with our outbound exchange requirement of 75% average. Once nominated the student and faculty complete the learning agreement form. Once all procedures have been completed, the faculties or departments communicates the outcome with the international office, which issues a support letter for the mobility. Procedures on Staff Exchange academic and non-academic positions	Academic and administration staff procedure is also as transparent as possible. Respective department's heads or deans assist in the selection and nomination process. Once nominated the staff member and faculty complete the work plan form. On completion of the nomination process the faculties or departments communicates the outcome with the international office. Which issues a support letter for the mobility and contact partner institution and inform them about the nomination.
