SUBMISSION FOR FACULTY APPEAL

- Prepare a comprehensive and truthful appeal letter or motivation letter.
- Attach all documents supporting the claims of your appeal.
- NO additional or supplementary documents will be accepted once you have submitted your application.
- Upload all the documents in the correct place and in the correct format.
- Do this before the cut-off date/deadline.
- Inform your sponsors and/or your family of the possibility of exclusion.



CONGRATULATIONS!

Your Faculty appeal was successful and you are readmitted!

- The Faculty letter will state all the **conditions of your** readmission.
- Make sure you fully understand what your academic performance should be to avoid future exclusion.
- Speak to your Academic Success Coach (ASC) and set up a study plan.
- If you indicated that you were ill, you need to state how it is going to be addressed.
