

4. Minimum admission requirements

Applicants with school leaving qualifications other than the South African National Senior Certificate (NSC) or Independent Examination Board (IEB), should meet the following admission requirements for undergraduate studies at the University of Pretoria:

4.1 Universities South Africa (USAf) exemption requirements

The first requirement to study a bachelor's degree in South Africa is a Universities South Africa (USAf) exemption. Universities South Africa (USAf) coordinates and issue exemption certificates based on the prescribed requirements stipulated in the gazetted exemption regulation.

All applicants who obtained a school leaving qualification other than the South African National Senior Certificate (NSC) or Independent Examination Board (IEB), must submit a Certificate of Complete Exemption* or Foreign Conditional Exemption obtainable from Universities South Africa (USAf).

8. Medical aid

Important information for study visa holders

In terms of South Africa's Immigration Act 13 of 2002, non-South African citizens who are holders of study visas, or wish to apply for study visas, must have medical aid cover for the duration of their stay in South Africa. Ensure that the medical aid is registered with the Council for Medical Schemes in South Africa. Before applying for study visas, students registering for studies at the University on study visas can apply online for medical aid cover accepted by UP. For any student who enters South Africa on a study visa without the required medical aid cover, it is recommended that he/she joins Momentum Health (Ingwe option) or any medical aid listed at the following link: https://www.medicalschemes.com/ MedicalSchemes.aspx?flt=L

NOTE: Some South African Consular Offices, where students apply for study visas, accept international medical insurance submitted by students applying for study visas. However, the University of Pretoria requires full-degree students, exchange students and study-abroad students to join a South African medical aid

registered with the Council for Medical Schemes in South Africa, and to be able to provide proof of membership for the full year, January to December. International insurance is not accepted. Students who fail to adhere to this stipulation will be obliged to join Momentum Health (Ingwe option) on campus upon arrival, before being allowed to register. A student visiting South Africa for a period shorter than 90 days and entering on a visitor's visa is exempted from this rule.

The Javett Art Centre at the University of Pretoria The home of the art of Africa

In recent years there has been an increase in the worldwide interest in the art of Africa. Conversations and research have focused on contemporary practice, repatriation and restitution, the future of the creative industries in Africa and the role that they have to play in the continent's economy.

With one foot firmly rooted in academia, and the other imbedded in the public, the The Javett Art Centre at the University of Pretoria (Javett-UP) makes the art of Africa accessible, relevant and engaging. The building is erected on the south campus of the University of Pretoria and connects the university with the city of Tshwane via a bridge over Lynnwood Road. Underneath the building, the student gallery links the architecture and visual arts departments of the university, and a number of other exhibition spaces which house temporary exhibitions.

Aside from temporary exhibitions, the Javett-UP houses, amongst others, three permanent collections. They are the AngloGold Ashanti Barbier-Mueller Gold of Africa collection, the Javett Foundation's collection of 20th century South African art, which contains a number of significant works and the Mapungubwe Gold, an archeological collection which is historically and culturally important for South Africa, the southern African region and the world.

The Javett-UP is a collaborative, multidisciplinary space. As part of the University of Pretoria's research, teaching and learning resources, the centre engages with the public by educating communities about the art of Africa, encouraging interaction and engagement. The centre aims to be an institution that encourages engagement with the ideas, methodologies and concerns of the art of Africa. In this way, the space becomes a platform for education and learning; conversations about creativity and innovation, contributing to the discourse on the art of Africa and reflecting upon historical and political events as interpreted by artists.

In partnership with the University of Pretoria and other international universities, the Javett-UP will host an on-going program of fellowships and residencies. These will be introduced to encourage cross-disciplinary practice around the Art of Africa, placing the Javett-UP at the forefront of defining the future of the continent.

10. Temporary residence permits

All foreign nationals wishing to enter South Africa will have to adhere to the New Immigration Regulations.

The New Immigration Regulations of 2014 were published in Government Gazette No 37679 in terms of section 7 of the Immigration Act of 2002 (Act No 13 of 2002) and came into effect on 26 May 2014. Both prospective and returning students are advised to visit www.vfsglobal.com/dha/southafrica for all the required information.

The Department of Home Affairs has announced the opening of visa and permit facilitation centres in 11 cities located in the nine provinces of South Africa. (VFS Global). Visa and permit applications will be accepted at any of these centres for assessment by the Department of Home Affairs in Pretoria.

Non-South Africans with legal residence permits can apply for visas or permits at these centres. Citizens from countries other than South Africa are required to hold a valid passport and a temporary residence permit, such as a study visa endorsed for study at UP. Citizens from countries other than South Africa wishing to enter South Africa should only apply for study visas once they have received an official letter of admission. Study visas must be obtained before travelling to South Africa. First applications for study visas will no longer be accepted within the horders of South Africa.

However, if the institutional targets have not been met by the closing date, then that programme will remain open for admissions until the institutional targets are met. Closing dates are indicated by means of a red footer number that is beside the name of the programme (refer to the dates at the bottom of each page). For selection programmes the closing date is the final date for applications.
