
New application process for special examinations:

Students who are unable to write an examination due to unforeseen circumstances or illness must apply online for a **special examination**. This application must be done within three days of the date of the examination that was not written. Click on the following link to download the form: <u>Application for admission to a Special Examination</u>.

- 1. Complete, sign and scan as a PDF document, and
- 2. Scan the medical certificate as a PDF document.
- 3. Go to your Student Services Portal, Click on Service request
- 4. The following will be displayed




Click on "Create New Request




Click on Enrollment related and click on Next



Select Special examination application and click on Next






#Only 8 of the 9 faculties are displayed. Click on

- Submit the original documents (the application form including the medical certificate) within three days of the date of the examination that was not written.
