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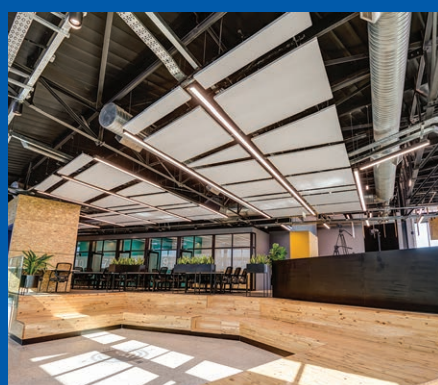

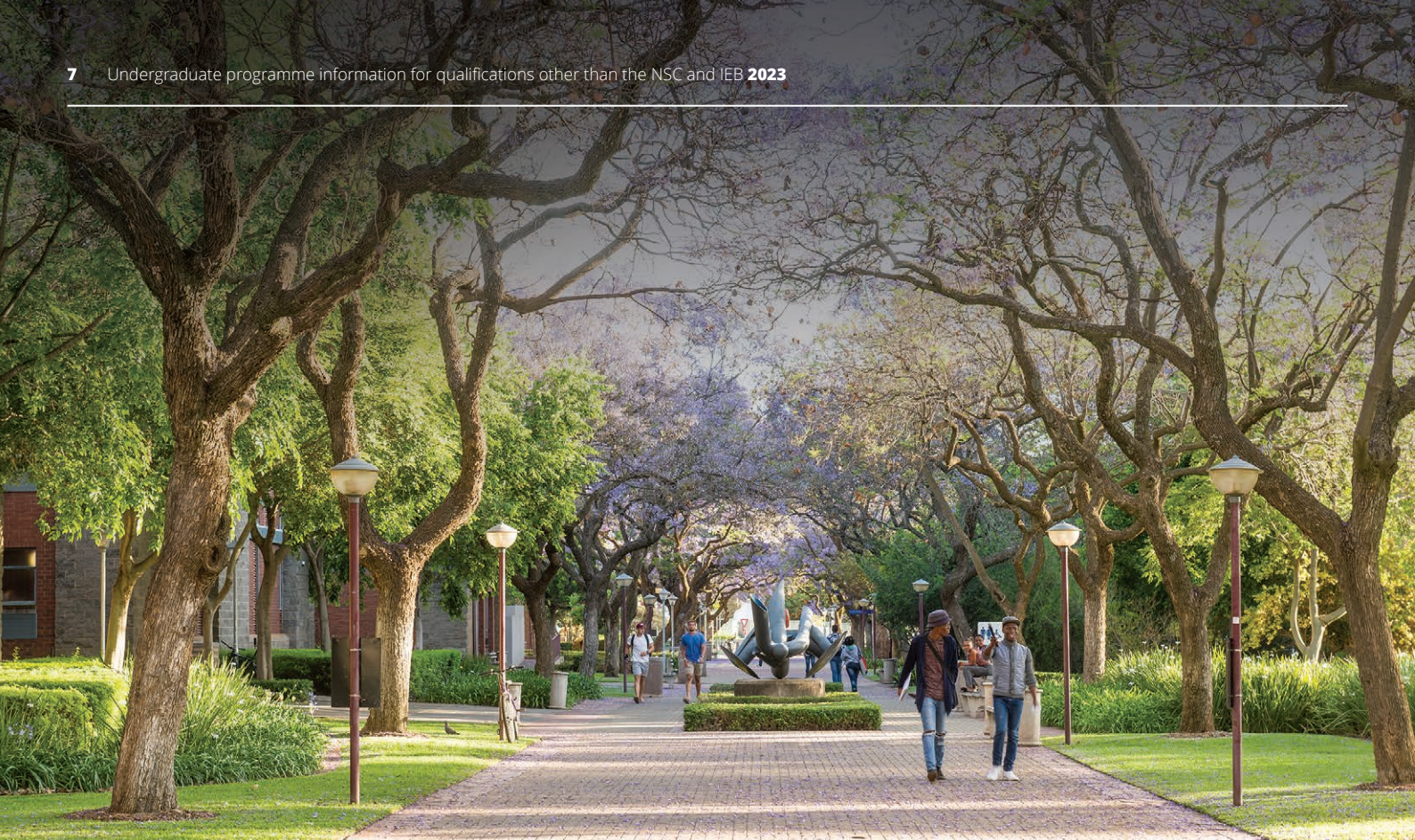

4. Minimum admission requirements

Applicants with school-leaving qualifications other than the South African National Senior Certificate (NSC) or Independent Examination Board (IEB) should meet the following admission requirements for undergraduate studies at the University of Pretoria.

4.1 Universities South Africa (USAf) exemption requirements

The first requirement to study a bachelor's degree in South Africa is a Universities South Africa (USAf) exemption. USAf coordinates and issues exemption certificates based on the prescribed requirements stipulated in the gazetted exemption regulation. All applicants who obtained a school-leaving qualification other than the South African NSC or IEB, must submit a Certificate of Complete Exemption* or Foreign Conditional Exemption obtainable from USAf. The University of Pretoria no longer accepts exemption based on mature age.

4.3 The University of Pretoria (UP) programme-specific requirements

All applicants who obtained a school-leaving qualification other than the South African NSC or IEB must submit the following documents to be considered for a study programme at UP:

- school qualification certificate from the country of origin
- subjects passed at exit level
- school qualification grading system
- certificate of Complete Exemption* or Foreign Conditional Exemption obtainable from USAf
- South African Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT), IELTS OR TOEFL results, if requested by the appropriate faculty. Refer to pages 9 and 10

School leaving qualifications from countries not mentioned above eg New Zealand, Spain, Morocco, Scotland, Australia etc: These qualifications will also be considered provided they comply with USAf exemption requirements for a complete/foreign exemption certificate. Faculties will determine admission requirements based on the school subjects passed and their symbols/percentages.

5. South African school-leaving certificates other than the NSC and IEB

5.1 Accelerated Christian Education (ACE)

This qualification is no longer accepted at the University of Pretoria.

5.2 General Education Development (GED)

South African GED graduates who graduated up to 2019 may be considered for admission provided they qualify for an exemption certificate issued by USAf and comply with university admission requirements, as well as faculty subject requirements. South African GED graduates who graduated after 2019 cannot be considered for admission to UP as the diploma is not accredited by USAf and will not be considered for exemption. Applicants from the USA who completed the GED may apply for a Foreign Conditional Exemption certificate issued by USAf accompanied by their SAT/TOEFL/IELTS results.

5.3 School of Tomorrow (SOT)

This qualification is no longer accepted at the University of Pretoria.

5.4 National Certificate (Vocational) (NCV) Level 4

(Refer to Government Gazette of 7 December 2018)

The University of Pretoria may consider NCV candidates, provided they meet the exemption for bachelor's status criteria as well as the programme requirements.

Minimum requirements to obtain NCV Level 4:

- Offer at least seven (7) subjects
- Obtain minimum of 40% in an official language (Home Language Level or First Additional Language Level) provided that the language chosen is a language of learning and teaching of the institution.
- Obtain minimum of 30% in either Mathematics or Mathematical Literacy
- Obtain minimum of 40% in Life Orientation
- Obtain minimum of 50% in four (4) Vocational subjects

Minimum requirements for admission to a Higher Certificate, Diploma or Bachelor's Degree:

Higher Certificate

- NCV Level 4 issued by the Council for General and Further Education and Training

- Compliance with the requirements for the language of learning and teaching in the higher education institution
- Must meet the minimum requirements of the higher education institution

Diploma

- NCV Level 4 issued by the Council for General and Further Education and Training
- At least 40% in three (3) *Fundamental subjects* including the language of learning and teaching in the higher education institution
- At least 50% in the three (3) compulsory *Vocational subjects*
- Must meet the minimum requirements of the higher education institution

Bachelor Degree

- NCV Level 4 issued by the Council for General and Further Education and Training
- At least 50% in three (3) *Fundamental subjects* including the language of learning and teaching in the higher education institution
- At least 60% in four (4) compulsory *Vocational subjects**
- Must meet the minimum requirements of the higher education institution

* Three (3) of the four *Vocational subjects* are to be selected from ONE sub-field.

An applicant who holds an NCV must also meet the faculty and degree-specific requirements as indicated in the faculty tables from page 16. English and Mathematics (if applicable) must have been taken as fundamental subjects and must have been passed on an achievement level as indicated in the tables. Physical Sciences (Vocational subject) (if applicable) must have been passed on achievement level 4 (70–79%).

6. National Benchmark Test (NBT)

The University of Pretoria no longer use the NBT results for admission.

7. IELTS and TOEFL tests

The IELTS and TOEFL tests are used to assess students' English proficiency at university level. These tests are mainly used in South Africa. More information is available at www.ets.org/toefl and www.ielts.org. Refer to the subject requirements as indicated in the faculty tables from page 16.

8. Scholastic Assessment Test (SAT)

The New SAT Entrance Exam is a standardised test used for college and university admissions mainly in the United States of America. The SAT score is required by USAf for exemption purposes and UP needs the SAT scores to determine eligibility for admission at UP.

10. Medical aid

10.1 Important information for study visa holders

In terms of South Africa's Immigration Act 13 of 2002, applicants from countries other than South Africa* who are holders of study visas, or wish to apply for study visas, must have medical aid cover for the duration of their stay in South Africa. Ensure that the medical aid is registered with the Council for Medical Schemes in South Africa. Before applying for study visas, students registering for studies at the University of Pretoria on study visas can apply online for medical aid cover accepted by UP.

For any student who enters South Africa on a study visa without the required medical aid cover, it is recommended that he/she joins Momentum Health (Ingwe option), Compcare Wellness Medical Scheme (The Network Option) or any medical aid listed at the following link:

NOTE:

(a) Some South African Consular Offices, where students apply for study visas, accept international medical insurance and hospital plans submitted by students applying for study visas. However, the University of Pretoria requires full-degree students, exchange students and study-abroad students to join a South African medical aid registered with the Council for Medical Schemes in South Africa, and to be able to provide proof of membership for the full year—January to December. International insurance and hospital plans are not accepted. Students who fail to adhere to this stipulation will be obliged to join Momentum Health (Ingwe option) or Compcare Wellness Medical Scheme (The Network Option) on campus upon arrival, before being allowed to register. A student visiting South Africa for a period shorter than 90 days and entering on a visitor's visa is exempted from this rule. In such cases, students will be issued with a temporary residence permit (TRP) or a stamp on arrival at the port of entry into South Africa. (b) Should you rely on sponsorship, please ensure that you advise your sponsor of this requirement as soon as you get your sponsorship or acceptance. It is not sufficient to produce a letter indicating medical health cover sponsorship. The sponsor must organise payment for the required medical aid cover directly to the medical aid company—separate to that of the tuition fees.

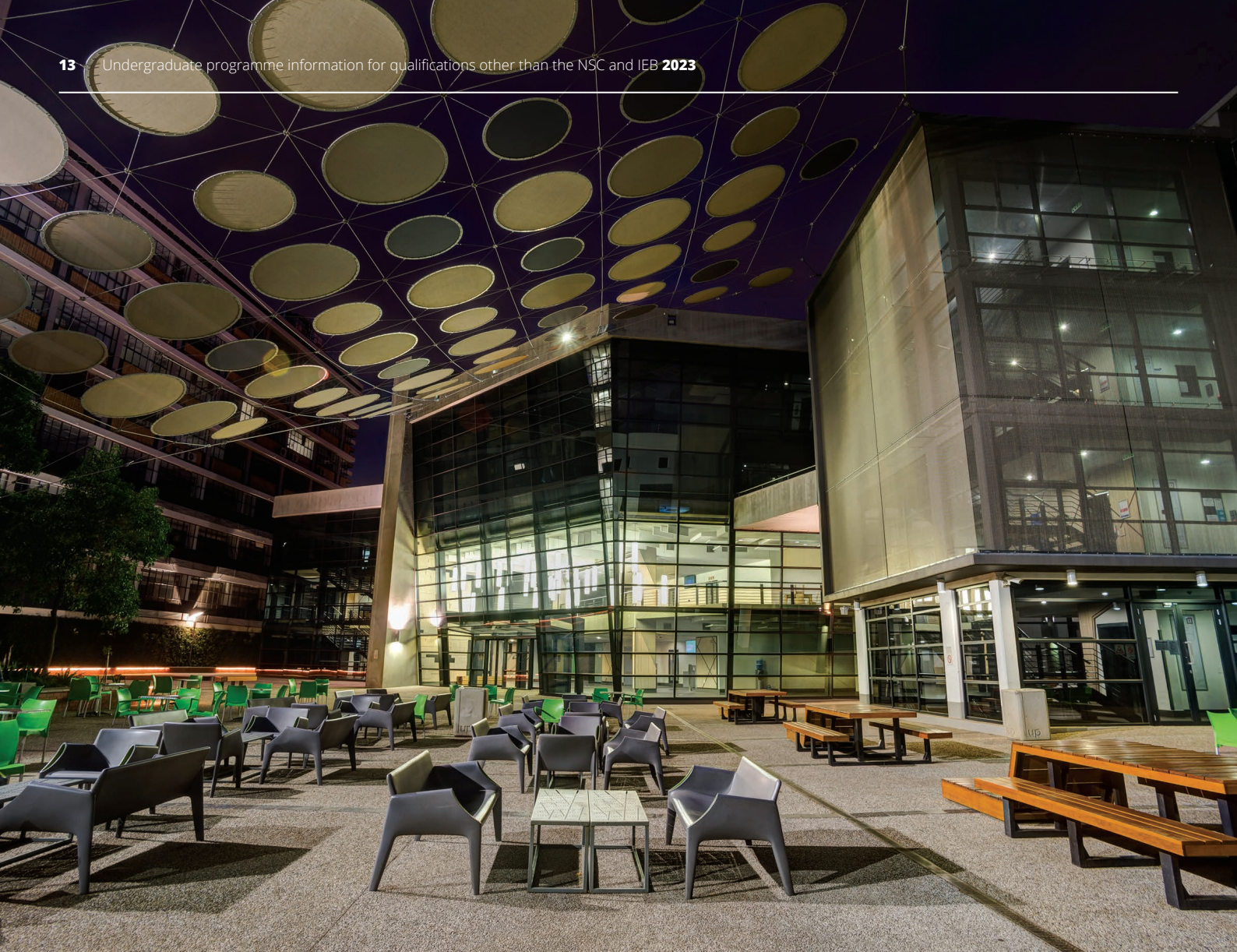

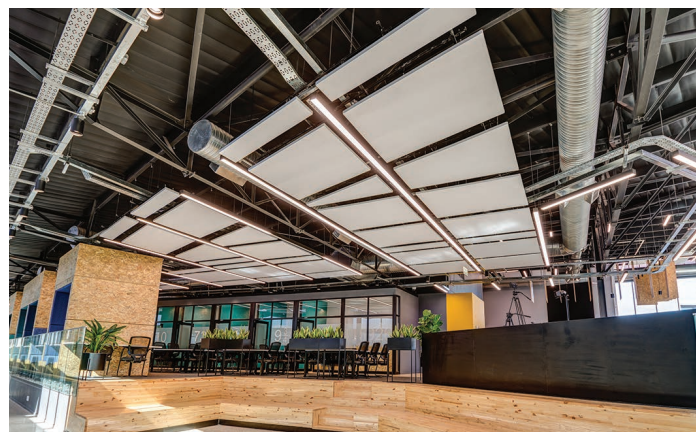
