## REGULATIONS AND SYLLABI FOR UNDERGRADUATE QUALIFICATIONS

### **New system of teaching and learning**

In the year 2000, the University of Pretoria intends to phase in a new system of teaching and learning which meets the requirements and uses the guidelines set by SAQA (the South African Qualifications Authority) and the NQF (the National Qualifications Framework). This new system consists of outcomes-based and market-oriented learning programmes. In this booklet on the *Regulations and Syllabi for Undergraduate Qualifications*, you will find detailed information on the programmes that are offered in the Humanities as a faculty from the year 2000.

### **Transitional measures for students who registered for a first degree before 2000**

Students who registered for a degree or diploma course at the University of Pretoria starting before or during 1999 will be permitted to complete their studies toward the qualification they registered for. The Alphabetic List of Modules supplied in this booklet on the *Regulations and Syllabi for Undergraduate Qualifications* indicates which modules students must take instead of the old subject courses (semester or year courses) toward qualifications for which students registered before the year 2000.

Students who registered for a degree or diploma qualification before the year 2000 but who prefer to switch to one of the new programmes, may do so in consultation with the programme manager for the new programme. However, such students must meet all the requirements for the new qualification.

## **1. REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION**

### **1.1 Minimum requirements**

To register for a programme culminating in a first degree, candidates must possess a valid matriculation certificate with university entrance. Where relevant, candidates must also meet special admission requirements for admission to certain programmes and packages as required by the admission regulations and faculty regulations that apply to the faculties and departments concerned.

### **1.2 Applying for admission**

Students who want to register at the University of Pretoria for the first time, or wish to reregister after a break in their studies, must apply for admission. Applications for admission to programmes which culminate in a first degree must reach the University by 30 September of the year preceding study. However, for programmes where there is selection and which culminate in career-specific qualifications, the final application date is 30 June of the year preceding study.

Candidates may also be expected to pass an admission test and to undergo language and computer skills assessments.

### **1.3 Symbols obtained**

Candidates who register at the University for the first time must present an official record of the symbols which they were awarded for their matriculation subjects in the matriculation examination. This record must be presented before or on 15 May of the candidates' first year of study.

#### 1.4 Conditional exemption

Candidates who have not achieved matriculation exemption may be considered on the merit of each individual case for admission, provided that they:

- (i) possess at least a three-year **tertiary qualification** (higher education qualification) obtained at an institution other than the University of Pretoria;
- (ii) have been awarded a certificate (at another institution) accepted by the University as equivalent to a matriculation certificate with university admission;
- (iii) have graduated from another tertiary institution or were previously admitted as a graduate of such an institution;
- (iv) pass an entrance examination as required by the University of Pretoria.

**NB:**

Candidates cannot be admitted to a degree programme on the basis of a conditional exemption certificate. Some faculties do admit candidates with a certificate of conditional exemption on the basis of their age for specified programmes. Candidates are advised to contact the faculty administration of the faculties concerned.

The Senate reserves the right to limit the number of students permitted to register for a particular degree programme. In such cases, the Dean of the faculty concerned selects the students who are admitted from the pool of candidates who meet the requirements.

#### 1.5 Selection

Students are only admitted to the following degree programmes subject to their being selected for the programmes:

**BA in Social Sciences specializing in Social Work**

Students must be selected to be admitted to the second year level. Candidates are selected on the basis of their academic marks, their results in psychometric tests and a personal interview. Students who have completed part of a programme in Social Work at other universities must also undergo selection for continued studies at UP. Information is available from the package co-ordinator concerned.

**B Communication Pathology**

Candidates who have been provisionally selected, must participate in group tests and an interview on a specified date (usually during August of the year preceding study). The final selection is done on the basis of the results of the tests and interviews. More details are available from the package co-ordinator.

**BA in Art training**

Students who have been provisionally selected for the **Drama** package are subject to final selection in January of the actual year of study.

Students who have been provisionally selected for the **Music** package, must complete a further practical test. The date for the test is arranged in consultation with the package co-ordinator.

Students who have been provisionally selected for the **Fine Arts and Art History** package, must complete a further theoretical and practical test before the start of the academic year. The date for these tests is arranged in consultation with the package co-ordinator.

#### 1.6 National first degrees

**1.7 Postgraduate qualifications**

Requirements for admission to postgraduate training programmes, closing dates for applications and selection criteria for such programmes are set out in the Humanities' booklet entitled *Regulations and Syllabi for Postgraduate Qualifications*.

**1.8 Medium of instruction**

The University presents its courses in two languages, namely Afrikaans and English (with the exception of specialist language courses). The medium of instruction for a module is determined by student demand and by the academic and economic justifiability of presenting the module in that language. All students remain responsible for finding out whether the modules in the package they would like to choose are offered at all year levels in Afrikaans or English or both languages. For administrative and other services, students can choose whether they would like the University to communicate with them in Afrikaans or in English. Also see the comments on the University's interim language policy.

**1.9 Language skills**

From 2000 onwards, the language skills of students who register at the University of Pretoria for the first time will be assessed at the start of their first year. Depending on the results of this assessment, every student in the Humanities:

- must obtain at least 12 credits in the language skills modules EOG 151, 152, 153, 154 which are presented by the Language Skills Unit;

or

- may obtain less than 12 credits in the language skills modules offered by the Language Skills Unit, but must make up the required number of credits, in consultation with the programme manager and package co-ordinator concerned, with modules offered by the School of Languages

or

- must obtain 12 credits in modules offered by the School of Languages and/or other approved modules in consultation with the programme manager and package co-ordinator concerned .

**1.10 Computer skills**

The following modules in computer skills are compulsory for all new first year students in the Humanities from 2000 onwards: CIL 171; 172, 174 (see the module contents on pp. 121 of this booklet). If students believe that they already meet the requirements, they may arrange, in consultation with the Computer Literacy Centre, to complete an exemption test. Students who pass the exemption test do not need to pay class fees, but must pay test fees.

The EAG 151 module is compulsory for all students who register for undergraduate study at the University for the first time in 2000. The RES 151 module is a basic research module which is compulsory for all students who register for undergraduate study at the University for the first time in 2000.

**1.12 Bursaries and loans**

Details about bursaries and loans are available on request.

### 1.13 Boarding accommodation

Applications to board in the University residences for a particular year may be submitted from 1 April of the preceding year. Applications will only be considered if there are vacancies in the residences, and prospective students are advised to apply as soon as possible.

**NB:** Admission to the University does not automatically mean that residence accommodation is available.

### 1.14 Changes to regulations and fees.

The University reserves the right to amend regulations and syllabi where necessary and to change course fees without prior notice.

## 2. GENERAL REGULATIONS GOVERNING PROGRAMMES AND PACKAGES IN THE HUMANITIES

**(These regulations apply only to degree programmes for which students register for the first time in or after the year 2000.)**

### 2.1 Specific requirements

Prospective students must check which requirements apply to particular programmes, packages and modules offered in the Humanities and other faculties. The details of the particular requirements for **packages** are set out in the section on packages (Paragraphs A.1 to A.8). The details of the particular requirements for **modules** are set out in the **LIST OF MODULES IN THE HUMANITIES** on pp. 103 in this booklet on the *Regulations and Syllabi for Undergraduate Qualifications*.

If students wish to take a module offered by another faculty, they must determine the admission requirements for that module, as well as the sub-minima required for examination papers, supplementary examinations, etc. in the faculty concerned. Details concerning this appear in the **LIST OF MODULES FROM OTHER FACULTIES AND DEPARTMENTS** as well as in the booklet(s) on the *Regulations and Syllabi for Undergraduate Qualifications* for the faculties concerned.

### 2.2 Registration for a particular year

Students register at the start of each academic year for all the modules they wish to take in that year, in accordance with the rules governing the programme and package the students wish to register for. Students may change the modules they are registered for only in the first two weeks of the module cycle (quarter). Students who register late must check on the general regulations that govern late registration in the Faculty.

### 2.3 Evaluation

#### 2.3.1 Formal evaluation

Students are evaluated continuously in every module and are awarded a module mark based on their achievements in activities such as tests, assignments presentations, portfolios, practical work, etc. as determined by the departments concerned.

**2.3.2 Requirements to pass**

These requirements are determined by the individual departments.

**2.3.3 Supplementary examinations**

At the end of a module cycle, the examiners may require students who have been awarded a module mark of between 40% and 49% to do a supplementary examination on selected aspects of the work (in order to pass or to be awarded a distinction).

**2.3.4 Promotion**

Promotion is arranged by the various departments in consultation with the Dean of Humanities.

**2.3.5 Remarking of examination papers**

Students who wish to have their papers remarked, must submit their request to the Dean of Humanities, who will inform the department concerned if the student's request for a remark has been granted.

**2.3.6 General regulations**

General Regulations G.1 to G.15 apply to the Bachelor's degree qualifications.

**3. QUALIFICATIONS IN THE HUMANITIES (from the year 2000 onwards)**

The qualifications (degrees and diplomas) listed below are offered in the Humanities from the year 2000 onwards. Please note that the **new names for these qualifications** in brackets will only apply once the Minister of Education has approved them.

In some cases students can exit after completing part of a programme, on condition that a certificate or diploma has been awarded to these students for passing certain modules. Details on such points of exit may be obtained from programme managers.

The structure and details of the programmes and packages culminating in each of the qualifications listed below are set out comprehensively in the **SYLLABI FOR DEGREE AND DIPLOMA PROGRAMMES**.

- (g) **Duration**
- Normally, a training programme for a national first degree takes three to four years. This period may be shorter or longer, depending on the student's needs and progress.
- (h) **Composition of programmes**
- (i) Programmes are structured teaching and learning units compiled by programme managers to achieve specified market-oriented outcomes.
  - (ii) A programme can culminate in more than one degree or diploma qualification, depending on its particular focus and the combination of its various components.
  - (iii) In accordance with particular focal areas within programmes, specialization packages have been designed. Packages are coherent units consisting of available and appropriate modules offered in the Humanities and other faculties and departments.
  - (iv) The modules which constitute programmes and packages can be grouped into three categories, namely **fundamental**, **core** and **elective modules** (see the glossary of terms on p. 16 of this booklet on the *Regulations and Syllabi for Undergraduate Qualifications*).
  - (v) Students themselves put together a package in consultation with one of the programme managers and/or package co-ordinators, taking into account the rules for the composition of a programme and applicable requirements for taking certain modules.
  - (vi) A BA without specialization can be put together in consultation with student counsellors. This programme can be put together in such a way that it meets the student's particular individual career needs.
  - (vii) Students must achieve a total of at least 360 credits to be awarded a degree qualification.

(viii) The following quantitative and qualitative distribution of modules is recommended for three-year degree programmes:

(aa) first year of study: 20 modules worth 6 credits each

(bb) second year of study: 12 modules worth 10 credits each

(cc) third year of study: 8 modules worth 15 credits each

Note that this is the minimum number of modules which may be included in a programme. Also note that the credit values of modules from other faculties and departments (not in the Humanities) may differ, but that the total number of credits for the package must still be 360 for a degree qualification to be awarded.

(ix) All the modules in a particular package which are either compulsory or elective, are listed in the **SYLLABI FOR DEGREE AND DIPLOMA PROGRAMMES** in A.1 to A.8. The modules in packages have been arranged according to the categories of fundamental, core and elective modules, and alphabetically within each category according to the module codes (the alphacodes).

The alphacode indicates the discipline to which the module belongs, e.g. APL (Anthropology), GES (History), SLK (Psychology), etc. The first digit of the module code indicates the year or level of study: e.g. 151 shows that the module is a Level 1-module; 255 that the module is taken at Level 2; and 352 that the module is taken at the third year level.

**(i) Deviations from the prescribed programme combination**

Any deviation from a prescribed programme or package combination (e.g. recognition of credits already obtained, admission to further modules, deviations from the prescribed module structure, etc. may only be made subject to the approval of the Dean, after consultation with the programme manager and package coordinator concerned.

**(j) Degree with distinction**

To be awarded a degree qualification with distinction, a student must achieve an average of at least 75% for the 8 modules taken at the third year level, and at least 75% for each of 6 or more of these 8 modules.

## GLOSSARY OF TERMS

### A. GENERAL

**academic year:** This is the time unit, as determined by the University Council, during which a student can complete his/her studies at a particular year level. An academic year can consist of 28 weeks (or more).

**after-hours studies:** This refers to studies undertaken by registering for the University's after-hours (Tuks After 5) study programme, and attending lectures in courses/programmes that are offered after the end of the day's intramural lectures. After-hours studies may also refer to studies which are offered, in accordance with the regulations, over a longer period than the normal minimum duration for the degree or diploma.

**extended programme:** This is a training programme for a degree or diploma qualification which is taken over a period which, according to the regulations, is longer than the normal minimum duration for the course or programme.

**registration:** This is the process candidates need to follow to become registered students in accordance with the general requirements and regulations of the University and for the course/programme for which they want to register.

**year(s) of study:** These are the first, second, third and further years of study for which a student can register in order to achieve a particular degree qualification.

## **B. GLOSSARY OF TERMS WHICH APPLY TO COURSES FOR WHICH STUDENTS REGISTERED IN 1999 AND EARLIER**

**examination mark:** This is the mark awarded to a student in a subject course on the basis of an examination in a paper/papers, including practical and clinical examinations, where applicable.

**final mark:** This is a mark calculated on the basis of the semester mark/year mark and the examination mark awarded to a student in a subject course, using a formula which is determined from time to time by means of regulations for every subject course.

**semester mark/year mark:** This is a mark awarded to a student on the basis of tests, class work, practical work or any other work which was done in a subject course during the semester or year.

**subject:** This refers to a defined field of study from which one or more (subject) course(s) can be selected.

**(subject) course:** This is a defined aspect of a subject to which a (subject) course code has been allocated (from the year 2000 onwards, the equivalent term will be the **module**)

**(subject) course code:** This is an alphanumeric code consisting of a fixed number of capitals (the alphacode) and numeric combinations which identify the year of study and semester (if it refers to a semester course), e.g. AFR 220 (from 2000 onwards, the equivalent will be called a **module code**)

## **C. GLOSSARY OF TERMS WHICH APPLY TO PROGRAMMES FOR WHICH STUDENTS CAN REGISTER FOR THE FIRST TIME IN THE YEAR 2000**

**core module:** This is a module which is essential or central to achieving the outcomes for a particular programme or package.

**credit (or credit value):** This refers to a value unit linked to particular learning activities. In the case of modules, the value is related to the complexity (including the year level at which the course is taken: 1, 2 or 3) and the total number of learning hours needed to complete the module successfully. Credit values are also attached to the completion of qualifications: to complete a three-year Bachelor's degree, students must normally be awarded a minimum of 360 credits (on average, 120 credits at each of the three year levels, with a minimum of 72 credits at the third year level).

**elective module:** This is a module from a group of modules from which students can choose to contextualise the central learning activities of a programme or package and to broaden their insight into their chosen area of specialization.

**fundamental module:** This is a module which serves as the academic basis or foundation of the core learning activities for a particular programme or package.

**learning hours:** This refers to the notional number of hours students should spend to master the learning content of a particular module or programme. The total number of

learning hours for a module consists of the time needed for lectures, practicals, self-study and any other activity required by the training programme. Learning hours for modules are calculated on the basis of **40 working hours per week x 28 weeks = 1120 + 80 additional hours for evaluation = 1200**. For undergraduate modules, the total number of learning hours per module are calculated using the formula **number of credits (per module) x 10**.

**level (or year level):** This is an indication of the complexity of a module (e.g. first, second or further level), and also implies a particular credit value. The (year) level is indicated by the first digit of the module code (thus, AFR 352 is a module in the discipline of Afrikaans at Level 3). A programme which culminates in a National First Degree qualification normally consists of first, second and third level modules.

**module:** This is an independent, defined learning unit (normally presented over seven weeks) which is a component of a package or programme.

**module code:** This is a unique alphanumeric code for a module. It consists of a fixed number of capitals (the alphacode) which indicate the name of the discipline (e.g. APL for Anthropology), and numeric combinations which identify the year level and the order in a series of modules (e.g. 152, where the 1 shows that the module is presented at the first year level, the 5 shows that it is a module, and the 2 shows that it is the second module in the series of Anthropology modules at that level).

**module mark:** This is the mark awarded to a student on the basis of tests, class work, practical work or any other work completed during the period of presentation.

**package:** This is a group of modules which are connected and share a particular focus and are taken by students as an area of specialization within a programme. The name of the package indicates the area of specialization, and is part of the name of the degree or diploma qualification, e.g. **BA Languages (African Language and Cultures)**, where *African Language and Cultures* refers to the name of the specialization package.

**package co-ordinator:** This is the individual responsible for organising, compiling and arranging the teaching of a particular package. This individual can also guide students in their combinations towards a package so that they meet the programme requirements, taking into account a student's personal interests and preferences.

**programme:** This is a comprehensively planned, structured and coherent set of teaching and learning units (modules) which culminate in a students' being awarded a particular qualification (certificate, diploma or degree), e.g. a *Programme in Political Science*. Programmes can be subdivided into further areas of specialization, namely packages.

**programme manager:** This is the individual responsible for the overhead management, organization and composition of a particular programme, with the packages which make up the programme.

**qualification:** This is the particular (career-oriented) outcome of a programme for which a diploma or degree is awarded in the Humanities.

**Requirements for specific modules**

A candidate, who has

- (a) passed a grade 12 (Matric) examination in German or passed the unit of four modules DTS 151, 152, 153 and 154 (German for beginners) (or DTS 102 before 2000) will be admitted to the unit of two modules DTS 155 and 156;
- (b) passed a grade 12 (Matric) examination in German will not be admitted to the unit of four modules DTS 151, 152, 153 and 154 (German for beginners);
- (c) passed a grade 12 (Matric) examination in French or passed the unit of four modules FRN 151, 152, 153 and 154 (French for beginners) (or FRN 102 before 2000) will be admitted to the unit of two modules FRN 155 and 156;
- (d) passed a grade 12 (Matric) examination in French will not be admitted to the unit of four modules FRN 151, 152, 153 and 154 (French for beginners).

Students are pointed to the following prerequisites:

- (e) DTS 151, 152, 153, and 154 is a closed unit and should all be taken. DTS 102 (German for beginners before 2000) remains a qualifying course even if the two units DTS 155 and 156 as well as DTS 157 and 158 have been passed. DTS 155 and 156 as well as DTS 157 and 158 are closed units.
- (f) Students who want to specialize on second year level in **Career Orientated German** take DTS 251 and 252 as well as DTS 253 and 254 which are closed units.  
Students who want to specialize in **German Literature** take DTS 255 and 256 as well as DTS 257 and 258 which are closed units.
- (g) Students who want to specialize on third-year level in **Career Orientated German** take DTS 351 as well as DTS 352, 353 and 354. DTS 352 – 354 is a closed unit. Students who want to specialize in **German Literature** take DTS 351 as well as DTS 355, 356 and 357. DTS 355 – 357 is a closed unit.
- (h) In exceptional cases, a student who does not comply with the official prerequisites for admission to a particular module or group of modules in German, may at the discretion of the Head of the Department be allowed to register for such a module or group of modules. The Head of the Department may however require that an admission examination be taken.
- (i) FRN 151, 152, 153, and 154 is a closed unit and should all be taken. FRN 102 (French for beginners before 2000) remains a qualifying course even if the two units FRN 155 and 156 as well as FRN 157 and 158 have been passed. FRN 155 and 156 as well as FRN 157 and 158 are closed units.
- (j) Students who want to specialize at second-year level in **Career Orientated**

**French**, take FRN 253 and 254 in the second semester. These two modules are a closed unit. Students who want to specialize in **French Literature** take FRN 257 and 258 in the second semester. These two modules are a closed unit.

- (k) Students who want to specialize at third-year level in **Career Orientated French**, take FRN 351, 352, 353 and 354. FRN 351 and 352 is a closed unit. Students who want to specialize in **French Literature** take FRN 355, 356 and 357 as well as FRN 354. FRN 355 and 356 is a closed unit.
- (l) If French is taken as a major on third year level, the module FRN 354 (History of the French Language) is **compulsory** for students who take FRN 353 (Career Orientated French III) or FRN 357 (French Literature III).
- (m) In exceptional cases, a student who does not comply with the official prerequisites for admission to a particular module or group of modules in French, may at the discretion of the Head of the Department be allowed to register for such a module or group of modules. The Head of the Department may however require that an admission examination be taken.

**NB:** No credits can be earned for separate module of a prescribed unit of modules if the unit is not completed as a whole. This applies to all year levels for German and French.

**A.1.2 BA specializing in AFRICAN LANGUAGES AND CULTURES  
(Code 01130007)**

The purpose of this package is to provide qualifiers with a thorough knowledge of, and linguistic competence in, two of the following African languages: a Nguni language, (either isiNdebele or isiZulu), a Sotho language, (either Sepedi or Setswana), and/or Afrikaans. Learners will also obtain an in-depth knowledge of the multilingual and multi-cultural nature of South Africa, the socio-political context of the languages of South Africa and the difficulties inherent in cross-cultural and multicultural communication.

In consultation with the package organizer, the package can be structured in such a manner that a specific career-oriented qualification can be achieved. The areas of focus within the package are: translation, editing, publishing, lexicography or dictionary making, language planning and development, research, teaching, corporate communication, document design, information management, advertising, community development, tourism and politics.

A student is admitted to Music Theory 1 00 or 102 on basis of selection.
- (ii) A student who is not admitted to Music Theory 100, but who obtains at least 75% in Music Theory 102 at the end of the first year of study, may with the approval of the Head of Department, be admitted to Music Theory 200.
- (iii) A student who obtains less than 75% for Music Theory 102, must register for Music Theory 100 and pass it, before he or she will be admitted to Music Theory 200.

**(b) Practical Music**

Students choose a first and a second instrument from the following: Voice, piano, organ, harpsichord, violin, viola, cello, double bass, flute, oboe, clarinet, bassoon, French horn, trumpet, trombone, tuba, percussion, harp, guitar, recorder. The choice of a rare practical subject is based on the assumption that a suitable lecturer is

available for that particular subject. The University does not accept responsibility for providing a lecturer for these instruments at costs exceeding the normal.

**Note:** In order to be admitted to MTI 100 (Second instrument) in any instrument other than organ, harpsichord or singing, a student should have reached approximately UNISA Grade VI or a comparable standard on that instrument or in the case of organ, harpsichord, and singing, admission is at the discretion of the Head of Department.

**(c) Attendance courses**

- (i) In addition to the courses mentioned in the learning programme, students are obliged to attend the weekly recital classes.
- (ii) The conductor of the University orchestra can instruct students, who play orchestral instruments, to play in the orchestra.
- (iii) Unsatisfactory attendance of the recital classes and orchestral rehearsals may, at the discretion of the Head of Department, lead to refusal of admission to the examination in the first instrument.

**(d) Admission to a subsequent year of study**

- (i) A student must acquire at least 108 credits for music modules at level one for admission to the second year of study.
- (ii) A student must acquire all credits at level 1 (168 credits) , as well as at least 155 credits for music modules at level 2 for admission to the third year of study.
- (iii) A student must acquire all credits at level 2 (175 credits) , as well as at least 105 credits for music modules at level 3 for admission to the fourth year of study.
- (iv) With regard to all modules, a student may only be admitted to an advanced level of a subject if the student has acquired all credits for modules on the previous level of such a subject (e.g. 12 credits for MME 100 should be acquired before registering for MME 200), unless the Head of the Department grants permission to the contrary. An exception is MCS 401 and 402, which can be taken without the credits for MCS 300 having been acquired, on condition that the content of MCS 401 and 402 has not already been offered on third year level by the department.

- **Class attendance of at least** 75% in MBK Practical is required for admission to the examination.
- **Recommendation:** Students who wish to qualify as teachers in Human Movement Science, follow the HED curriculum after successful completion of the BA(HMS) degree. These students will be exempted from Human Movement Science practical classes in their HED year, but they will be required to assist in the sports training of Education students in accordance with the instructions of the Head of the Department of Biokinetics, Sport and Recreation Sciences.
