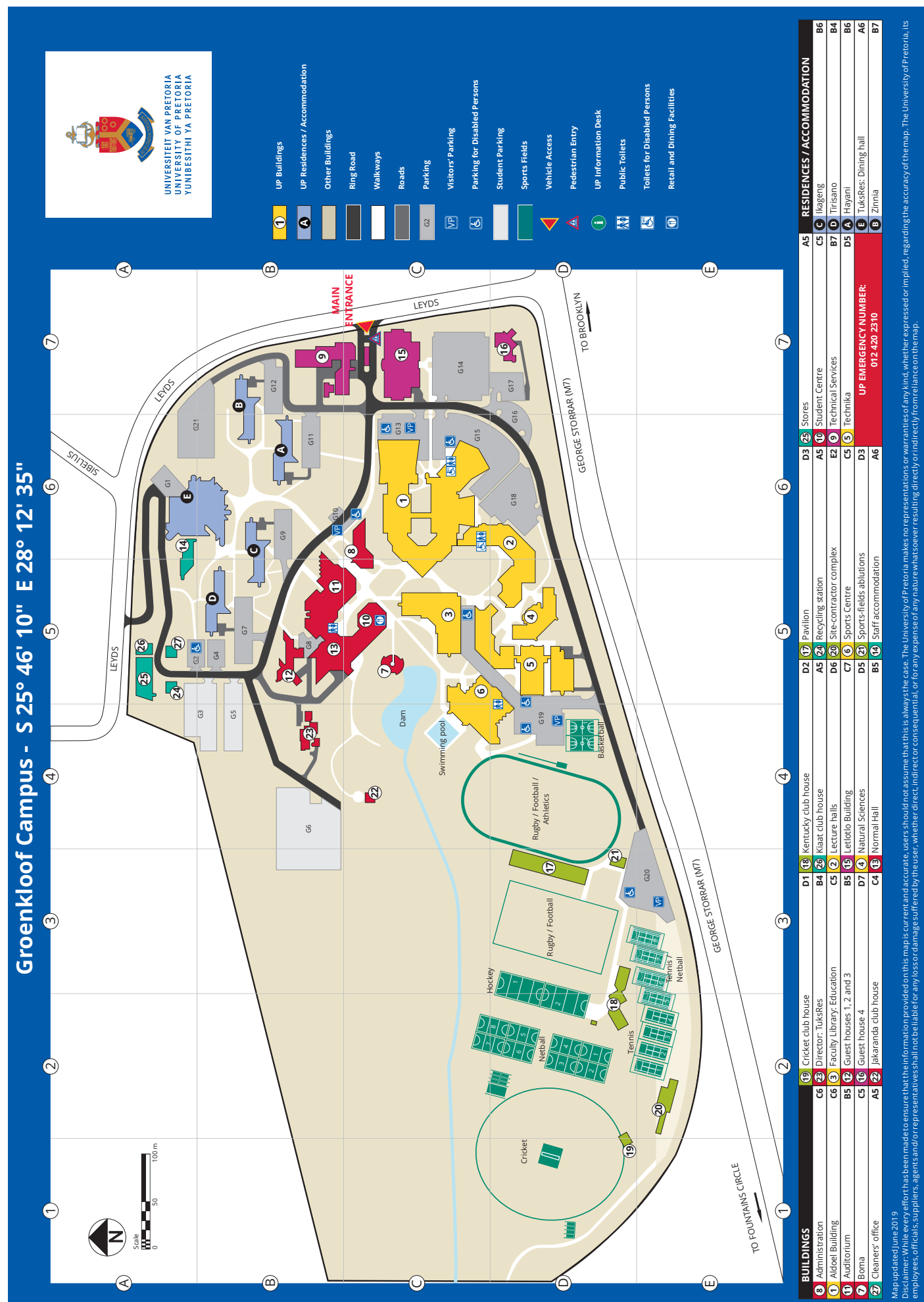




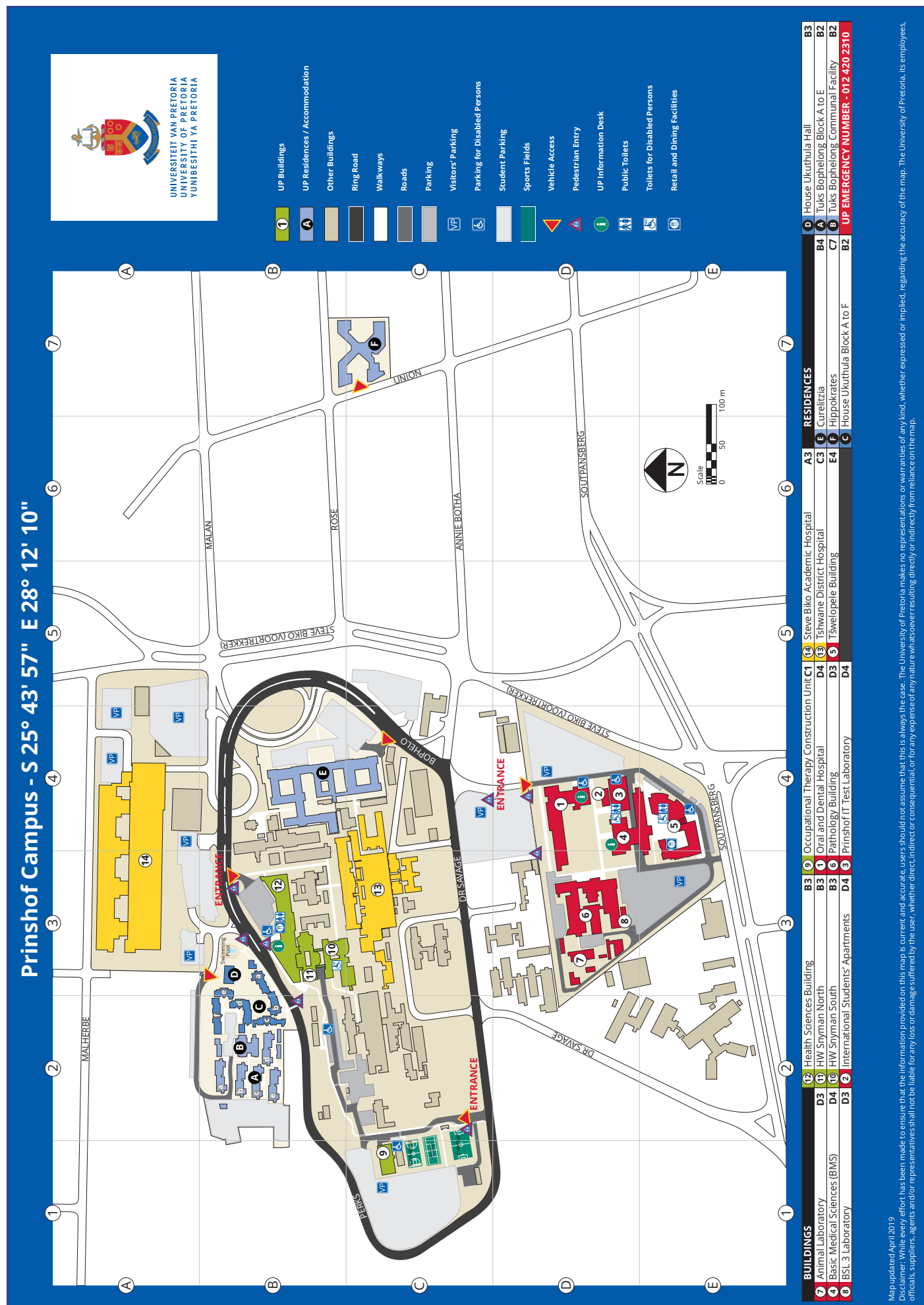
## 7.3 Hillcrest Campus map (UP sports facilities and hpc)



#### 7.4 Groenkloof Campus map (Faculty of Education)

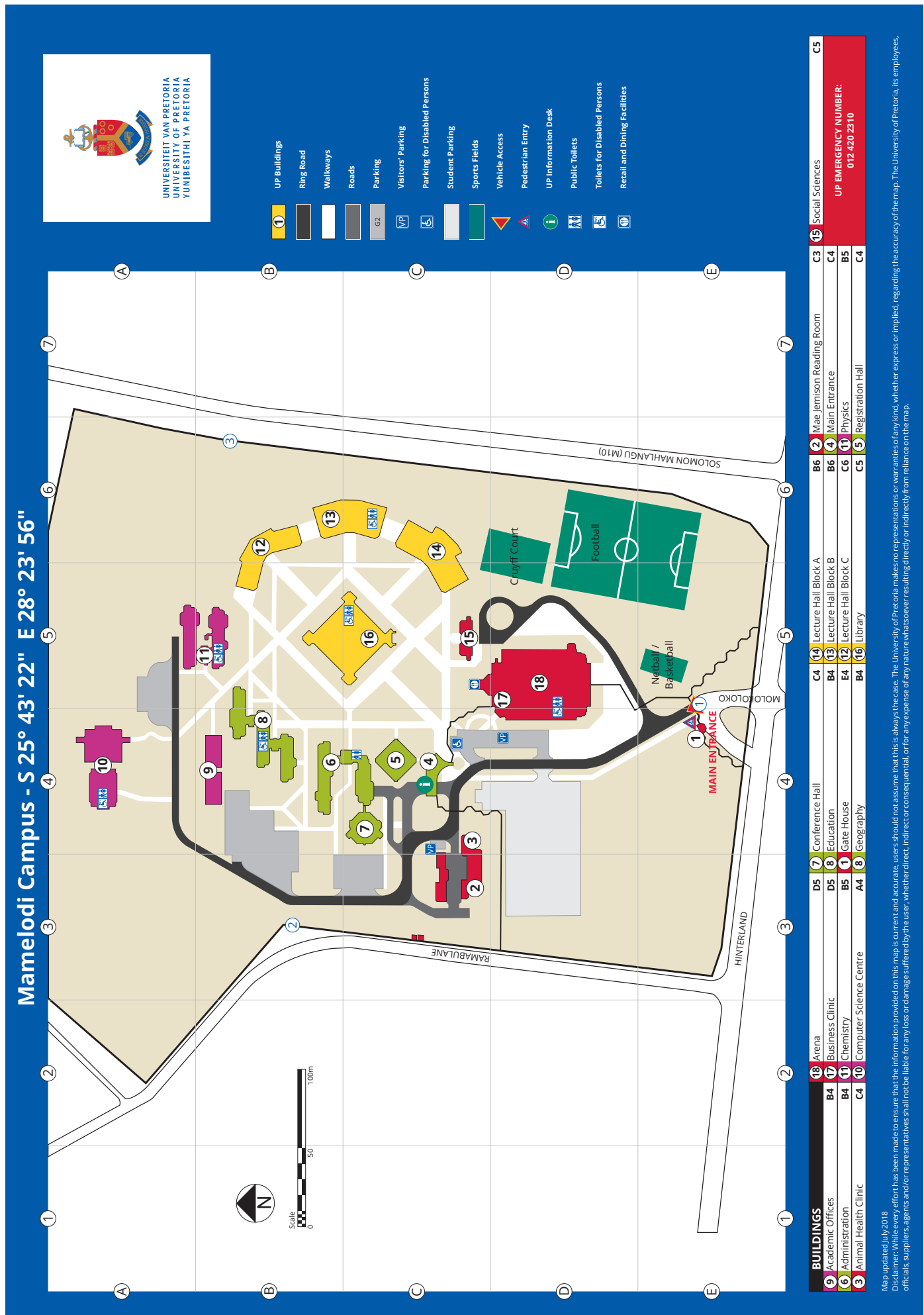


## 7.5 Prinshof Campus map (Faculty of Health Sciences)
