About BM-NHSP

The Bongani Mayosi National Health Scholars Programme (BM-NHSP) is an initiative by the National Health Research Committee (NHRC) and a partnership between the National Department of Health (NDoH), the Public Health Enhancement Fund (PHEF) and the South African Medical Research Council (SAMRC). The objective of the BM-NHSP is to fund the training of 1000 PhDs in health and clinical research over the next 10 years. Applications are invited for PhD scholarships tenable in South African universities. Funding is towards the completion of the degree and funding is made available for a full degree period (i.e. prescribed time for a PhD) as a tax-free scholarship for full-time study. The value of the scholarship is equivalent to the after-tax take-home pay of the applicant, in terms of the public service professional scales applicable to the qualification(s) of the candidate (excluding overtime pay). Applicants to note that once the benchmarking process has been completed (based on the criteria at the time) and a scholarship amount has been awarded, it will remain fixed for the full duration of the studies irrespective of a change criteria e.g. additional qualifications/credentials obtained or an increase in Occupation Specific Dispensation scales.

The BM-NHSP aims to contribute positively towards efforts to strengthen and accelerate progress towards equity in research capacity development within the National Department of Health Human Capital across South Africa. Where appropriate priority will be given to hitherto under-represented designated groups, institutions, and or under researched priority research niches.

The purpose of this particular request for applications (RFA) is to build capacity in four priority research areas namely: (i) mental health, (ii) violence, injury and trauma, (iii) digital health and (iv) rural health. The current funding opportunity is targeting applicants who preferably hold a MBChB or master's degree, are in their second year of PhD study within the specialized fields of Biostatistics, Data Science, Digital Health, Demography, Epidemiology, Health Economics, Genomics/Bioinformatics and Immunology.

Requirements for application (Check your eligibility before starting your application).

- 1) Must be South African citizen/permanent resident
- 2) Applicants must hold MBChB or a master's degree
- 3) Must have an officially approved PhD research proposal
- 4) Must be registered as a full-time PhD student, preferably in 2nd, 3rd or 4th year
- 5) Must provide written commitment of participation by an experienced research supervisor who is willing to train the student for the entire duration of the degree
- 6) The research supervisor must have research funding for the project and appropriate facilities for the scholar to effectively conduct the PhD research project

Selection Criteria (Use this list to make sure your application is complete)		Attached check (V)
1.	Suitability of the candidate: 1-page only: motivation demonstrating candidate's suitability and describing how success in the BH-NHSP application will impact candidate's career. It should be accompanied by an abridged curriculum vitae containing a full list of research outputs in the last seven years and other meritorious achievements.

Quality of the science: ≤2 pages only: abstract of the PhD proposal outlining the rationale, design, feasibility, plans for research translation and information dissemination as well as potential impact of the proposed research project. NB: Proposed research project should be aligned with the priority research areas for this specific call. Attach official approval letter of research proposal	
3.	Supervisor's abridged track record and signed commitment form: ≤3 pages only: an abridged outline of publications, grants and experience in research supervision of PhD students and a signed commitment form (Annexure A)	
4.	Research environment: ≤ 1-page letter from the host institution outlining the career plan of the applicant upon completion of the PhD.

Scholarship Conditions

- Scholarship holders are expected to spend at least 90% of their time conducting research.
- Teaching and clinical activities may not take up more than 10% of the time of the scholar.
- Scholarship holders may not receive, concurrently with this scholarship, other bursaries, grants
 or remuneration which bind them to enter the service of any organization without prior
 engagement towards agreement with the Division of Research Capacity Development SA Medical
 Research Council (SAMRC).
- Candidates may not hold a bursary from more than one South African Government statutory entity at any given time.
- Scholarship holders may not receive, concurrently with this scholarship, other non-binding remuneration/fellowships and grants without engaging with the Division of Research Capacity Development of the SAMRC.
- Scholarship holders may not, without seeking approval from the Division of Research Capacity Development of the SAMRC's, register at a university other than that through which the application has been submitted.
- Once the scholarship has been awarded, the scholarship holder may not change his/her supervisor without informing the Division of Research Capacity Development of the SAMRC.
- Supervisors will be expected to submit 6-monthly progress reports.
- Application for renewal of funding will be considered on an annual basis, success thereto will be subject to satisfactory progress being made.
- Successful applicants will be required to enter into an agreement with the SAMRC to complete their studies within the specified time period.
