TEACHING & LEARNING

This has enabled access and success for an increasing number of students. The teaching and learning approach is based on inquiry-based learning, hybrid learning and community-based learning. This means that students can ask questions and do research in their field to learn and discover answers on their own; while also being taught in a classroom environment and accessing additional resources online.

HYBRID LEARNING AMIDST DISRUPTION

A system is in place for students to buy their own devices at very competitive rates but more than **6 000** computers are available in computer laboratories across all campuses and within residences for student use. There are Wi-Fi hot spots across all campuses for use by students with their own devices.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

The COVID-19 pandemic was a reminder of the impactful role that universities play in making the world a better place. The Faculty of Health Sciences is committed to conducting research that matters, improving society through skills development and community-based projects.

- Life-Changers Fund: the Faculty has established this student solidarity fund to support students with the tools and subsistence required to complete their academic training and to provide future support for the same purpose. The Food Parcel Project, as part of the student solidarity fund, will help ensure that our students do not go hungry while studying at the institution.
- **COSUP:** COSUP provides a community-based, low threshold response to the use of drugs, which seeks to reduce harm, and adds to and is integrated with the primary health, HIV and social services of the City of Tshwane.
- Informal Settlement Health Research: The project consists of a core 'roaming' multi-disciplinary health team offering services with on-site support for community health workers from four informal settlements in/around Pretoria, including Zama Zama, Melusi, Woodlane Village and Cemetery View. The team visits each Holistic Health Post weekly, covering three core areas of care: health across the spectrum, nutrition and education.

STUDENT PROGRAMMES

- Nelson Mandela Fidel Castro Medical Student Training Programme: The Faculty is one of the institutions that hosts this programme, which aims to improve human resource workforce capacity and strengthen the health care system in South Africa, as well as contribute towards the attainment of SDGs on health.
- Buddy Mentor System: Third-year students apply to be mentors for four to six first-year students in a structured programme of one year.
- Tuks Undergraduate Research Forum (TURF): TURF is a platform for UP students to simplify the world of research and orchestrate undergraduate research initiatives. TURF prepares its students for the ever-changing modern world of health care by providing early exposure to research through mentorship.
