#### Phase I (2011-2015)


- Strengthening doctoral training through the creation of a collaborative doctoral training program in public and population health
- Strengthening research infrastructure and capacity at African universities.

#### Phase II (2016 - 2020)

- Sustaining the production of a critical mass of well-trained African academics at the doctoral level
- Institutionalization of CARTA interventions at the African partner universities
- Securing the future of CARTA graduates through the provision of postdoctoral opportunities


#### Phase III (2021-2025) dubbed CARTA2025

- Maintenance of a pipeline of highquality Early Career Researchers (ECRs) – doctoral and post-doctoral
- Creation of research hubs in partner institutions
- Mainstreaming of CARTA interventions at partner institutions -Creation of research supportive environments
- Enhance the engagement of the CARTA community with society

- → → 400 students supervised at different levels




## **CARTA ECR numbers**



# **CARTA** postdoctoral awards




### 12-month long:

- Traditional or split fellowship
- Re-entry grantEligible to one of each

### 73 postdoctoral awards to 55 graduates

	Male	Female	Total
Have only one award	17	20	37
with one award – re-entry g.	15	15	30
with one award - fellowships	2	5	7
Have two awards	12	6	18
Re-entry as first award	5	0	5
Fellowship as first award	7	6	13



## Trickle down effects



#### INDIVIDUAL LEVEL

Fellows remain engaged in research and establish themselves as independent researchers Fellows are competent in research dissemination

Fellows become research leaders – leading teams, large projects, or cutting-edge work in their field Fellows successfully engage students in their research projects and supervise them to graduation Fellows maintain cross-border networks and collaborations



#### INSTITUTIONAL LEVEL

Institutional research capacity is bolstered – more researchers and greater capacity of researchers who are retained in institution

Institutional capacity for research, including infrastructure, is increased

Research output at institutional level is increased

Capacity within institution for postgraduate teaching and supervision is strengthened

Mentorship programmes are institutionalised

Enabling environment for research is strengthened



#### MACRO LEVEL

A critical mass of researchers in Africa is attained and sustained


The value of the knowledge/research produced by African scholars is acknowledged by the public and policymakers in Africa

African institutions become policy influencers and sources of decision support




### **CARTA ECR numbers**

#### Publications per year (before, during and after the fellowship)



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


#### Publications per year (before, during and after the fellowship)
